Easter Has The Power to Create Hope in Us All

While it was still dark on that first Easter morning, Mary Magdalene bravely made her way to the tomb in which the body of Jesus was placed after His Death on the Cross. She went to complete the rites of anointing for the dead, which because of the Sabbath restrictions, were not done on Friday. She found the tomb empty and despaired that someone had removed the body of Jesus. Then, beyond all expectation, she heard her name, "Mary," and recognized Jesus, alive, risen from the dead.

An ancient Easter Sequence, a hymn sung before the Gospel on Solemnities, "Victimae Paschali Laudes," addresses Mary about that experience. "Tell us Mary, what did you see?" To which she responds, "Christ, my HOPE, is risen." Mary experiences hope from her encounter with the Risen Lord. "Christ, my HOPE is risen." May this Easter Sunday and the Fifty Days of this Easter Season renew in you that same hope that Mary Magdalene experienced on the first Easter.

God did not abandon Jesus in death, nor does God abandon you. Sin and death are defeated on the Cross of Christ. Through Baptism, you share in that Easter victory. You can know hope despite experiencing the effects of both sin and death. What Easter did for Mary Magdalene, it can do for you – touch you with hope, which bears to you the face of Jesus. It is not abstract. It is an encounter with the Risen Lord born of faith.

Václav Havel, a playwright and former president of the Czech Republic, wrote about hope: it "is not the conviction that something will turn out well, but the certainty that something makes sense no matter how it turns out."

Meaninglessness is not the last word for those to whom the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter brings hope. The "Catechism of the Catholic Church" teaches, "Hope keeps us from discouragement; sustains us during time of abandonment; preserves us from selfishness, and leads to happiness." The sorrows, cruelties and difficulties of everyday life can lay heavily on our hearts, minds and souls. Easter is God's new creation, and it has the potential to recreate us. It is God's work in Jesus and by faith in us.

Emily Dickinson in her poem, "Hope Is the Thing With Feathers," wrote that like a bird, hope flies in and "perches in the soul." May hope perch in your soul as you celebrate Easter Sunday and throughout the Easter Season. May HOPE nest in your life so that you, too, can confess with Easter faith, "Christ, my Hope is Risen."

Easter is nearly here! Soon, the Sanctuary will be adorned with beautiful flowers and filled with joyful music as we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Savior.

One timeless feature of our Easter celebration is the altar frontal. Designed by Susan Beck, the frontal was created at the request of the Geestmann family, as a memorial to Peter Geestmann. The design features the following:

The Boat: Jesus is our calm in the storm. The boat symbolizes Christ's Church. **The music staff** on the boat alludes to the hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God."

Loaves and Fishes: *Jesus is our spiritual nourishment.* The loaves and fishes allude to the Gospel story of Jesus feeding a crowd of 5,000.

Butterflies: *Jesus will return.* The butterflies symbolize the Resurrection.

Calla Lilly with Flame: *The Holy Spirit will fill God's chosen people.* Another symbol of the Resurrection, the Calla Lilly transitions into the flame of Pentecost. The flames are shaped into a "P" and "G," for Peter Geestmann.

PROPERTY REPORT – APRIL 2023

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform any maintenance and/or improvement items on the "Office" To-Do list, or that we are notified about or uncover ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help. Our recent activities have included:

- We refurbished the lawn tree Christmas light strings, ready for next year.
- We finished a cleanout, straightening up, and inventory activity in the room 100 storeroom. We **thank Vinny** for re-activating an old Buffer and cleaning the floor
- We changed the **batteries** in the Rear Sanctuary, and room 2000 Thermostats, restoring their function.
- We uncovered a no heat situation in the Library. Investigation revealed the Circulator had blown zone relay fuse, which a new fuse could not fix. We called Bill Quinn (826-3253), our plumber, to resolve the mauled spring coupling and seized motor restoring the heat. (PIM \$430)
- We also uncovered water in the Ed Building boiler room overflowing the collection container under the pressure valve. Investigation found a **full 32-gallon expansion tank**, probably due to an internal bladder failure. We **drained the tank and charged it with air, resolving the problem** and saving a \$700 expense to replace.
- We monitored the roof work on the "last' section of flat roof over the pulpit area. The permanent fix was completed in two days and included raising the North A/C unit and welding 450SF of Bitumen material over ½ " insulation after removing all the old stones and base material. (PIM \$6,460).
- Low heat on the North end of the Sanctuary had us on the roof once again. A loose Fan belt was adjusted resolving the slipping condition, but the situation repeated itself a week later when we found the Belt completely off. A closer inspection showed a loose and wobbling fan pulley to be the problem. We aligned and tightened the pulley before replacing the Belt and adjusting the tension.
- We learned that "P&M doors" was called to replace a broken front Steinbicker upper door closer; twice to get a proper "hold open" unit installed. (PIM \$522). It is noteworthy that we have three such closers in stock to use had communication been better.
- We initiated a cleanout and straightening up of the lower Boiler room/Shop area, filling numerous boxes/bags, which were picked up by the metal man.
- For Daylight Savings, we changed the times on 10 telephones and the wall clocks.
- We restored a **missing downspout section** in the rear yard to prevent flooding and further sidewalk erosion. We also tightened a couple of **toilet seats**
- We identified and staged all the **old paint for the March STOP** program. We **thank Vinny and Gene** for taking it all to the Eisenhower Park drop off.

RESEARCH FOR POTENTAL LONG RANGE PROJECTS

* Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary**.

* Research the replacement of the wine stained Altar Carpeting.

* Research extending the **lawn sprinklers** to cover the East side of Steinbicker **after grass restoration**.

* Research the possibility and costs to remove and **refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.**

MISCELLANEOUS THINGS TO DO

See Roger, Bill, Craig, Gene, Bob H, or Vinny if you can help:

*Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.

*Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit?, Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. "Scout Project?"

*Repair numerous **Cement issues** around the property. (Back walk, Pit wall, Pointing, Washes)

* Price **professional intervention** to **r**epair a rear yard broken and sinking sidewalk square,

***Research and arrange** for a **"Seal coating"** and **"re-striping"** of the parking lot and the Parsonage driveway. **Some Parking lot Patching is also now needed.**

* Cleanup and clean out the lower shop area. (WKG)

* Cleanup and clean out Room 100. (CMPLT)

* Prepare the Christmas window spotlights for next year.

* Gather and discard all the "old" latex paint for the next "STOP" date. (CMPLT)

* Investigate and strengthen the Altar screen Filigree panels which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.

* Prepare and paint the Front Education building entrance trim. (Spring)

* Touch-up the Room 10/20 trim, missed by the painters and paint the new flagpole light socket (Spring)

* Prepare/paint the rusting "Loggia - Yard" steel door frame

* Prepare/paint all the steel window header mantles on the Sanctuary building.

* Prepare/paint the Room 2000 back door frame and rear shed frame.

* Spray additional "Flex-Seal" on the Southeast and South wall bases of the Ed. Building to prevent further leakage.

* Re-spray the rusting rooftop A/C Ducts with Aluminum Rustoleum ©.

* Investigate and tighten all loose toilet seat covers.

* Install new Doorstops on the lower bathroom doors.
