What's the Purpose of Interim Ministry?

Now that we are a few months into our time together, I'd like to share some thoughts about the nature and purpose of interim ministry. To some degree, interim ministry is just what it sounds like, a ministry that takes place between regularly settled calls. However, interim pastors are not merely "place holders." We are called by the Synod Council to provide intentional ministry in a particular context. While we have the same responsibilities and authority as regularly called pastors, we also address specific tasks outlined by the Synod, namely:

- •Property Assessment (e.g., appraisal, evaluation of short and long-term facility needs, inventory, etc.)
- •Insurance Evaluation (e.g., comprehensive liability, workers' compensation, and directors' and officers' liability insurance)
- •Financial Review (e.g., audit, review of accounting practices, stewardship, and related matters)
- Update the Constitution so that it reflects the most current ELCA model constitution for congregations
- Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT)
- Anti-Racism Training

My approach to interim ministry has been shaped by specialized training through the Interim Ministry Network, 27 years of ordained ministry in large and small congregations including a decade in campus ministry, several years as a lay leader, and a number of years in various roles in Lutheran social ministry organizations. I served as interim pastor/rector at three congregations before coming to Wantagh.

As an interim pastor, I bring new eyes, new ears, and a new perspective to what is very familiar to those of you who've been at Christ Lutheran for many years. When I ask why something is done in a particular way, I'm trying to understand - and to encourage you to think about things you might not have considered in quite a while. You'll often hear me say things like: Structures create behaviors. Are the structures currently in place creating behaviors that will help the community not only to survive but to thrive? Which behaviors address the needs of the community and which do not? These questions are relevant to every aspect of ministry. Are you ready to till the soil in preparation for a future blooming with possibility? I hope so.


Condolences



WELCA



WELCA will hold its next meeting on Wednesday, May 7th at 1PM in Room 2000. All ladies are welcome to join us.




