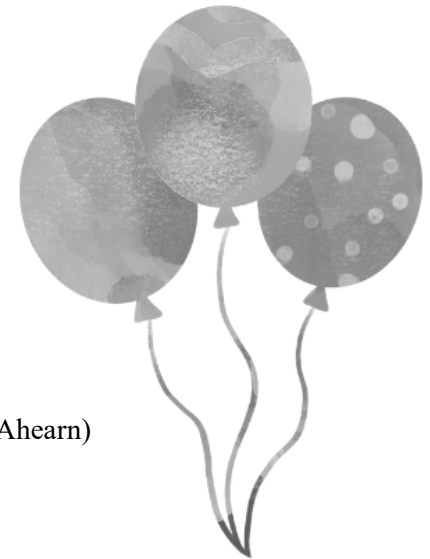

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

General Updates:

- **Safety:** Council approved the installation of two additional Automated External Defibrillators (AED's) in the Thrift Shop and Nursery School areas. This is in addition to the AED already installed near the



Sanctuary. The additional devices will ensure that this critical first aid can be easily accessed in an emergency.

- **Church Signage:** Council is in contact with the Town of Hempstead to have church signage posted along Wantagh Avenue. This will help us to be more visible.

Outreach:

- **Easter Baskets:** Through your efforts, we collected **73 pounds of food** for donation to the Lutheran Social Services New Life Center food pantry. We would like to particularly thank Confirmation candidate **Gracie Franz**, who contributed three large bags of groceries.
- **Birthright:** Our collection of baby and maternity items for Birthright is underway. A flyer with a list of needed items is included in this edition of the Spire. Thank you to all who have contributed so far! We appreciate receiving your donations by Sunday, May 5th.
- **Mother's Day Caring Sunday:** Memorials are being collected through Sunday, May 5th. All proceeds benefit the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition.

Worship & Music:

- **Sound System:** Our music program is getting an upgrade! Sound system upgrades have been approved and will begin in late April. Many thanks to everyone who helped get us to this point.

Christian Education:

- **Sunday School:** Sunday School families will be contacted to determine whether we will hold class the week of Spring Break, Sunday, April 21st.
- **Confirmation:** Confirmation families will be contacted to determine whether we will hold class the week of Spring Break, Sunday, April 21st.

Nursery Board:

- **Registration & Enrollment:** 40 students are registered for the 2024 Summer Program, and 87 students are registered for the 2024-2025 school year. 70 students are currently enrolled.
- **Recess:** The Nursery School will be closed April 22nd-30th for Spring Break.

Property:

- **Flooring:** The worn-down flooring in two Nursery School classrooms will be replaced on April 23rd.
- **Air Conditioning:** The new air conditioners for the Nursery School's Summer Program were delivered, and the necessary electrical work will begin shortly.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- **Sunday School:** It is hard to believe that we are approaching the end of this school year! Sunday School families will be contacted shortly in order to determine when we will hold our last class before Summer break.

PROPERTY REPORT – MAY 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the “Office” To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our **recent activities** have included:

- We **re-sprayed the residual mold** in the Parsonage basement boiler room a few more times. It was caused when a sprinkler pipe valve leaked a few months back. We will Shellac over it when the product becomes available.
- We obtained the name of a very reliable **Roof top HVAC Technician** from our plumber Quinn. Brian O’Conner (347-984-7486) resolved the **South Unit’s occasional heat** loss issue on the first visit, by cleaning the five corroded Gas Burners and correcting a flame sensor installation. We asked him to service the burners on both units and he agreed to get the parts and return. He obtained the parts, replaced them, and adjusted both roof top units. (PIM \$890) Note; that our continuing Belts and Filters maintenance work is all that “Carrier” recommended, and has **saved us an annual \$500 contract on each unit over the past 14 years.**
- **We changed and set the Church and Parsonage outside light timers for DST and all the Telephones and wall clocks.**
- We **disassembled the 11 NS computers** and removed them to the Garbage shed.
- We uncovered a large hole in the 2000 storeroom ceiling, probably caused by a “Shoe”. **We thank Vinny and Gene for installing a fabricated patch** and taping and spackling the area. We will paint the ceiling when we have time.
- We **removed a dozen old stacking chairs from above the room 2000** storeroom for thrift shop sale, and prepared a downed branch for TOH P/U.
- We cycled the **Flower stands and Candle stands** to and from storage for Easter.
- We sealed and insulated the old office overhead A/C duct eliminating the Drafts.
- We found the lower NS Thermostat on “Hold 70 degrees” and restored it!!
- We **replaced a few damaged lower bathroom-ceiling tiles.**
- **We thank Vinny for repairing a few loose/cracked tiles, refastening the Soap dispenser, and re-grouting** adjacent the sink, in a lower NS Bathroom.
- We responded to a “**leaking sink drain**” in a lower NS bathroom but after extensive work, needed to call the plumber, Quinn 516-826-3253, to replace the sink completely. (PIM\$394)
- We refastened a dislodged handle-set on a main floor classroom door.
- We changed a flagpole bulb and de-sensitized the pit and garage motion lights.
- We repaired a pushed-in screen in a lower classroom window.
- We **re-fastened the black tape on the overhead Organ/choir light fixtures**, and adjusted a music stand fixture to prevent the light shining into the congregation.
- We examined and serviced the South end Gym Exhaust Fan.
- We re-secured a **few loose floor tiles in Room 10** and filled a couple of voids.
- We repaired the “Parsonage Post and Rail”, and secured the “Parsonage and Neighbor’s Stockade” fencing as best we could. **All need replacing!**
- **We thank Roy Stone** for completing the A/C power outlets in the NS classrooms.

- We restored the “Plow Damaged” bumpers in the Parking lot.
- We **thank Vinny and Gene** for running and pinning a new cable to the NS director’s office, so she can also monitor the 16 security cameras in the area.

NEED RESEARCH FOR POTENTIAL LONG RANGE PROJECTS

- * Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary.**
- * Research a possible upgrade to the Sanctuary sound system. (Wkg)
- * Research a possible refurbish of the Education Building Main Floor Bathrooms.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the two Room 10 Bathrooms.
- * Research replacing the rear yard Stairway cover.
- * Research the possibility and costs to remove and **refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.**
- * Install five AirConditioning units in the main Ed. Building classrooms.(Wkg)
- * Investigate installing a Power Pole in the far Parking lot area for **Security.**

MISCELLANEOUS THINGS STILL NEEDING WORK

- * Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.
- * Repair numerous **Cement issues.** (Back/front walks, Pit wall, Pointing, Washes)
- * Price **professional intervention to repair a rear yard broken and sinking sidewalk square. !!!**
- * Investigate and strengthen the **Altar screen Filigree panels** which are **showing signs of looseness and cracking.**
- * **POWER WASH** the “Greens”, especially on the Sheds beyond the parking lot.
- * Re-Seal the old office Duct Work to eliminate winter drafts. (CMPLT)
- * Check for **loose stair treads** on the Room 10 and 20 stairways and re-glue.
- * **Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker.** Stones to pit? Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. Extend the Sprinkler system into to the area.
- * Rebuild, once again, the weathered Front Sanctuary Planter Boxes.
- * Complete the Painting of the Thrift Shop incoming shed.
- * **Replace the Parsonage/Parking Lot “Post and Rail” fencing.**
- * Check/reset coverage of the flagpole Sprinkler head. Zone 1/North of walkway.
- * Touch-up the “Rust areas” on the outside fire escape.
- * **Replace the water damaged ceiling tiles in the lower “east” bathroom. (CMPLT)**
- * Lubricate the bearings on the Gym South loft exhaust fan. (CMPLT)
- * Arrange for new carpeting in the Altar area, Referred to WELCA. (CMPLT)
- * Investigate A/C for the main classrooms in the Education Building. (CMPLT)
- * Arrange for new vinyl planking for the floors in the lower classrooms. Referred to the NS to schedule during the April school break. (CMPLT)

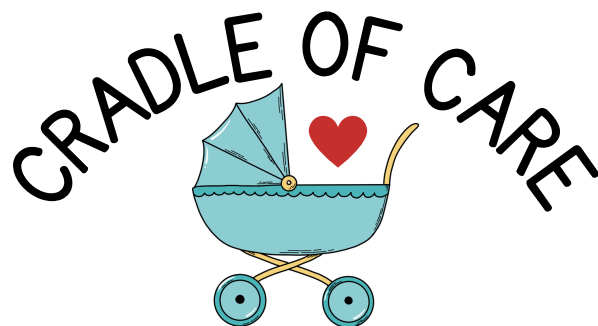

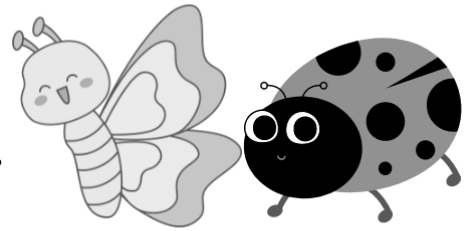
