Dear Friends,

The turkey that fed so many of us just a few days ago is now a fond memory. We just completed another church year and the first candle on the Advent wreath will be lit in just a few days. Christmas is right around the corner.

During this year, eight different pastors have presided at Christ Lutheran Church's altar. Our Nursery School has 79 students enrolled, our largest enrollment in many years. Our thrift shop continues to thrive, having recently had sales of \$1,850 in a six-hour period on a Friday. 107 coats were sold on that day, as the need for warm clothes becomes more prevalent with the passing of every cold day.

As we prepare for Christmas, the Church Council has also begun discussing the 2024 budget. Members of the congregation will be asked to approve that budget at the Annual Meeting on January 28<sup>th</sup>. We will still propose a compensation package expense line for a full-time pastor, just as we will put money in the budget for supply pastors. We want to be prepared for whatever the situation calls for.

We can look back on this past year with satisfaction. We have continued to minister to our community by providing quality education for our 2-, 3-, and 4-year-old students. We have provided a lifeline with our thrift shop for people who are financially strapped and depend on us.

As we look ahead to the new year, let us remain hopeful that the right candidate will come forward soon. Remember that we are always in the hope business.

May you be reminded of the wonder of Christmas during this time of the year as well as throughout the year ahead. We hope that this Christmas season is full of peace, joy, and happiness.

#### Worship & Music:

- Christmas Pageant: The Pageant will be held during 9AM service on Sunday, December 17<sup>th</sup>. Rehearsals are underway. Nicole Nicholson is coordinating.
- **Christmas Decorating:** Christmas decorations will start being put up early this year to accommodate for the Christmas Pageant. The Retirees will coordinate with Worship & Music and Nicole. All decorations with the exception of the Christmas altar adornments will be put up in time for the Pageant. The Advent banners and altar adornments will remain up until after the Advent 4 service at 9AM on Christmas Eve.

# THRIVENT FINANCIAL

We have had a busy fall. After the Country Fair on October 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, which benefitted the Interfaith Nutrition Network (INN), the USO, Lutheran Disaster Relief, and the Tunnel to Towers Foundation, as well as Christ Lutheran's ministries, members of the church worked with our



Confirmation students and friends to conduct a Food Drive for the benefit of local food pantries. About 800 items total and over \$200 were collected and used to stock the shelves of the food pantries at St. John's Lutheran Church in Merrick, the Salvation Army in Freeport, and the New Life Center in Uniondale. St. John's also received enough food to prepare a special Thanksgiving dinner to serve at the INN, and special Thanksgiving baskets for pantry clients. We found the customers at the **Merrick Stop & Shop**, the patients of Dr. Salerno at **Twin Dragon Acupuncture**, and members of our congregation to be so generous! We are also grateful to **Thrivent Financial** for providing a \$250 stipend to purchase additional needed items. Most of all, this experience was **rewarding and fun**. Thank you to all who made contributions and who volunteered with us.

Support the Christmas at Sea Program of the Seafarers International House (SIH). For several years, our congregation has supported the ministry of the Seafarers International House, which serves mariners around the world by providing spiritual, emotional, and tangible support. Seafarers spend long stretches of time away from family, friends, and community, and sometimes need assistance finding adequate housing, medical care, food, transportation, and counseling services. The holiday season can be especially lonely far away from home, while at sea or in a foreign land. Every year, our congregation collects items for care satchels that will be gifted to crew members of visiting ships by port chaplains. The care satchels will be assembled by volunteers on Thursday, December 7<sup>th</sup>. We ask that all donations be received by Sunday, December  $3^{rd}$ . Please consider donating the following items (the items listed in bold are **urgently needed**):

o One sweatshirt, hooded or unhooded, size M, L, or XL

- o One T-shirt, size M, L, or XL
- o Three pairs of socks, gym or thermal
- o One knitted winter cap (no pom-poms)
- o One coordinating-optional scarf (no pastels or fringe)
- o One can of nuts, chocolate bar, or healthy snack bar

This year, our Knitwits are contributing handmade hats and scarves for the care satchels. If you would like to make some, please see Jan Eastlund or Lilly Ann Munnich for fabric and a pattern. As they did last year, our Sunday School will participate in this project by writing out Christmas cards to place in the care satchels.

Items for donation may be purchased in-person and dropped off in the Seafarers box in the Narthex. If you prefer, you may also shop online and list Christ Lutheran as the delivery address. Seafarers has an Amazon wish list, which you can access by visiting **sihnyc.org/christmas-at-sea** and clicking "Christmas at Sea wish list" (items ordered through the wish list will be directly delivered to Seafarers International). Monetary donations are also accepted; please make all checks out to Christ Lutheran Church with "Seafarers" in the memo. Thank you to **Thrivent Financial** for providing a \$250 grant which will be used to purchase items needed to complete the care satchels. On behalf of the essential workers who have helped us to get through the pandemic and supply chain issues, thank you for bringing the joy of Christmas to those who cannot be home with loved ones.

## THE TWELVE PRAYERS OF **CHRISTMAS**

This season, you may find yourself humming along to a fanfavorite tune, "The Twelve Days of Christmas." But did you know that this Christmas Carol is actually a prayer?

Dating back hundreds of years, "Twelve Days" was originally a poem used by Christian clerics to celebrate Twelve-Tide, the dozen days of Christmas. Each day's "gift" was a symbol for different holy gifts. During the Middle Ages, when most people could not read, hearing the poem helped families to learn about the Christmas season. The poem is recorded as being printed for the first time in England in the year 1780. The poem was then set to music in 1909, and the rest... is history!

As you read on about the true meaning of this song, let us reflect on the true meaning of Christmas... and thank the Lord for our most special gift, His Son, Jesus Christ.

#### On the Day of Christmas, My God gave to me...

#### **<u>1. A Partridge in a Pear Tree</u>**

The partridge symbolizes Jesus, whose birthday is the first day of Christmas. The partridge in the song is actually female, because mother partridges are the only species of bird that will sacrifice themselves to protect their children.

#### 2. Two Turtledoves

The dove is a symbol for the Christian faith, because it's the bird of peace. The two turtledoves represent the Old and New Testaments, the story of our faith.

#### **3.** Three French Hens

Have you ever heard that French is the language of love? Well, here, that's not far off! This gift represents the Apostle Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, where he writes about faith, hope, and love. As Paul reminds us, "the greatest of these is love."

#### 4. Four Calling Birds

The four calling birds are Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, the writers of the Gospels. The word "gospel" means good news, called out to all of God's people.

#### 5. FIIIIVE GOOOOLLLDEN RIIIIINGSSSS!

The five gold rings symbolize the first five books of the Old Testament. In Hebrew, and in the Jewish religion, these books are called the Torah or the Pentateuch.

#### 6. Six Geese a-Laving

The six eggs laid by the geese represent the six days of Creation. On the seventh day, God rested... and so did the geese.

#### 7. Seven Swans a-Swimming

Swans are symbols of beauty. So, the seven swans are naturally the seven beautiful gifts of the Holy Spirit: Fear of the Lord, Wisdom, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Understanding, and Piety.

#### 8. Eight Maids a-Milking

In feudal England, being a milkmaid was considered the lowest-level job. It was primarily very poor women who did this work... and back then, being those two things meant you were easily overlooked. So, this gift reminds us that Jesus dearly loves and blesses those who feel alone: the poor in spirit, the mourners, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and the persecuted.

#### 9. Nine Ladies Dancing

The nine ladies represent the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

#### 10. Ten Lords a-Leaping

In feudal England, being a lord meant you were in charge of upholding justice in the land. So, the ten lords are code for the Ten Commandments, the laws all Christians follow.

<u>**11. Eleven Pipers Piping**</u> The eleven pipers represent Jesus' eleven Disciples. Remember, Judas is not included here because he betrayed Jesus.

#### **12. Twelve Drummers Drumming**

The twelve drummers represent the twelve points of the Apostles' Creed. Each beat drums at a different part of the Christian faith that we profess. While different denominations say different versions of the Creed, its core points are the same.

# **PROPERTY REPORT – DEC 2023**

**Our Volunteer Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- We handled the "Tool Time" Table at the Fair and assisted in closing up after. We <u>thank the Scouts for Moving all the "Heavy" material up to the gym, setting</u> <u>up the tables and breaking them all down to storage after. "Bully"</u>
- We placed the **"Fair Pumpkin Sign"** on the lawn and removed it to Room 100 storage after. We thank Vinny for making the new date panels.
- We had to call **Bill Quinn Plumbing 826-3253** to replace a **leaking Flushometer** on a main floor Men's room toilet (PIM \$400).
- We activated the heating plants for the Sanctuary and Education Building.
- Vinny unblocked the **drain hose on the South basement dehumidifier**, which was causing floor water.
- We shut down the basement dehumidifiers for the winter.
- Vinny installed an additional "Security Monitor" in Della's area.(PIM\$138)
- Vinny and Gene moved a storage cabinet between lower NS classrooms.
- Vinny repaired the **damaged Plumbing wall cover** in the main floor Men's room.
- Vinny replaced the **flood damage ceiling tiles** again after the issue was resolved.
- Vinny monitored the new Carpet installation in Della's area. (PIM \$686)
- We monitored the Sealing and Striping of the Parking lot and Sealing the Driveway. (PIM\$2,825)
- <u>Another Steinbicker "Door latch Problem"</u> was reported. Vinny arranged for a locksmith to repair the **previous faulty installation**! (PIM \$214).
- On a **Parsonage** security check, we found one main floor **Shower Door** "**Shattered**". We referred it to the Parsonage refurbishing committee to resolve.
- We appreciate that the NS was charged for the \$1,693 Roto-Rooter expense due to the "Baby wipe" issue rather than PIM.
- We Drained and removed all the hoses to storage, and shut off the front valve.
- We "winterized" the Rm10 Men's room vent, Covered the 2000 A/C unit and Closed the Room 10 dehumidifier.
- We located four of the six Gym Window fans and are still searching for the rest.
- We adjusted the lower Thrift shop door latching mechanism.
- We uncovered some **Sanctuary chairs**, not Clamped together and clamped them.
- We activated the <u>"Anti-Freeze" lamps</u> in the 10/20 area. Repaired 10/20 doorstop.
- We **initiated**, in mild weather, the ELCA lawn tree Christmas light Power and Star.
- We changed all the Telephones and wall clocks on the time change.
- We found the Altar/Pulpit Microphones "unplugged" and restored and checked out.
- Attended to activating the flower stands and Advent Wreath.
- We monitored the annual Fire Extinguisher Inspection.

- \* Check for loose stair treads on the Room 10 and 20 stairways and re-glue.

\*Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit? Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. "Scout Project?" Extend the Sprinkler system into to the area.

\* Rebuild, once again, the rotting Front Sanctuary Planter Boxes. (Scout Project?)

\* Complete the Painting of the Thrift Shop incoming shed. (Was Scout Project)

\* Install a pole for power to the far Parking lot area for Security. (Scout Project?)
