


PROPERTY REPORT – NOV 2021

Our **Small Aging Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and improvement items on the To-Do list that we can accomplish ourselves. We welcome Vinny Ciro, Gene Veltry, and Ron Feuring to our group as many hands make for lighter work.

Our activities recently have included:

- We moved numerous "Fair" items for the "Tool" table, from room 10 to the parsonage garage. We set up the tables and covered the area during the two day fair. We thank the Boy Scouts and their leadership for assisting us in moving the material from the Gym area.
- We replaced a few Fluorescents in room 2000, the Loggia, and room 10 and reset others failing to go on.
- We restarted our LED lamp conversion project for the Education Building on hold since February, waiting for the PSEGLI "Green Team's" response to a property survey. We made contact with PSEGLI and expedited an acceptance into their "rebate" program. This will offset the costs of purchasing the material. With our DIY concept, No-Sales Tax, and Free Amazon "Smile" Shipping, we expect a good and timely return on our investment; not to mention the ongoing power savings. The LED conversion requires rewiring the fixtures and removing all the old Ballasts. The first batch of ballasts to the scrap yard yielded \$26. The first LED Tubes were used in the 100 level east classrooms and Gym Kitchen. With the additional help trained in conversions, the 100 and 200 hallways, and all the remaining NS classrooms completed the four footer conversions on Columbus Day. Additional conversions will be completed as we do the Four Bathroom "U-Bend" fixtures. We are also replacing the old "circle line" hallway/stairway fixtures with new LED units. We are working to complete ASAP without interfering with the NS operation. IF ANYONE HAS NEED **FOR FOUR FOOT FLORESCENT** (Basement, Garage, Etc) TAKE THEM FROM THE CHRISTIAN ED/YOUTH ROOM BEFORE WE DISPOSE OF THEM....
- We re-secured, with H/D tie-wraps, the lawn canopy to minimize water pockets.
- We installed two new halyards, four shackles, guide rings, and a new replacement Flag on the Lawn Flagpole.
- We removed the "Fair Pumpkin" sign to storage.
- We investigated and re-activated two "dead" hands free soap dispensers. "Coagulated Soap" caused the condition in the pumps due to Covid non-use.
- We installed a new "Kid Combo" Toilet seat in the 200 level ladies room.
- We vacuumed the four heating plants in preparation for their use. Being unable to light the pilot on #1, we will be calling our Plumber to check it out.
- We removed the Hoses from outside into storage and shut off the faucets.



- *Research extending the lawn sprinkler to cover the East side of Steinbicker after grass restoration.
- * Research the possibility and costs to **refurbish the Steeple Bell** and Cradle.
