

Dear Friends,

Over the years, when some of us have pledged how we wanted our contributions to be allocated we could give to our current account, or we could contribute to the Property Improvement and Maintenance (PIM) account or towards Mission Support. In some cases people give to all three. But how much do we really know about what Mission Support is? When we make our monthly remittance for Mission Support, the check goes to the Metropolitan New York Synod (MNYS). In turn, MNYS submits 50% of what is received during the month from congregations to the Church-wide office in Chicago.

When the ELCA was formed in 1988, the key concept was that each congregation, its Synod and the Church-wide organization were interdependent of each other. None of the three can do everything by themselves. Each is dependent upon the other two partners to do the work of the church. Each segment of this interdependent relationship is charged with doing its unique share as part of this partnership. As an example, the ELCA is able to provide missionaries in various parts of the world where it is most needed. Individual congregations are able to support the sending of these missionaries by providing their financial support. A congregation by itself is not able to do this on its own. Those missionaries are found by Synods, usually with the recommendation of congregational pastors. Each partner in this relationship performs a unique task in order to place missionaries where they are needed most.

What are some of the other things that Synods and congregations do in this partnership? Synods are responsible for the candidacy process. Those individuals interested in becoming a pastor must go through a rigorous evaluation process. Where are those candidates found? At the congregational level. The Synod evaluates them and the ELCA provides the seminaries where the majority of these candidates go for their theological education. Each partner of the relationship does something that is unique to the process. The other two partners are not able to do what the third partner does.

Is Mission Support a one-way street? It's not, but it seems that's what most people see. When a congregation needs assistance, the Synod is usually the one that is able to provide it through the Bishop's office. In our case, finding our next Pastor is an important service that the Synod provides at no cost to our congregation. We can feel confident that the candidates we will be provided have been properly prepared to lead our congregation in ministry now and for many years ahead. The ELCA provides resources that enable candidates to be trained for a variety of different ministry settings. There is a need to train seminarians to operate in the inner city as well as in very rural locations. In our case, candidates will likely have done at least a year of internship in a suburban congregation so as to understand what is important in our kind of setting.

Once we do call a new pastor, the Synod will help provide many of the tools that that Pastor will need to do their job. The Synod will provide our next Pastor with continuing education support and other resources as we reach out to our community and grow the ministry of Christ Lutheran Church. Our role as a congregation, in addition to praying for the ministry of our Church, is to continue providing financial resources for the ministry of our Church here in our community, in the greater Metropolitan New York area through the Metropolitan New York Synod, and throughout the United States and the rest of the world through the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.



CLC HISTORY





This month, we will welcome our friends at St. John of Jerusalem Cemetery for their annual meeting. It is a fateful homecoming of sorts, as St. John of Jerusalem was the original home of our very own congregation!

In the mid-19th century, there was a large influx of German immigrants to New York. Farmers by trade, these new arrivals sought unoccupied land, a resource that Manhattan did not have readily available. Coincidentally and quite luckily, the Long Island Railroad had, within the same time, completed its expansion into what is now Eastern Nassau County. Going as far as a train would take them, these farming families arrived and established a thriving German-American community in the town of Jerusalem. This area is now known as North Wantagh. In 1859, the families of Jerusalem were granted an acre of property from the Town of Hempstead to build a chapel. With assistance from the German mission of the Methodist Episcopal Church, they organized a congregation, built a small chapel called St. John of Jerusalem, and established a cemetery.

For reasons not entirely clear, the congregation of St. John of Jerusalem dwindled. By the early 1900's, the chapel was used almost solely for funerals, and it remained that way for around two decades. Then, in 1926, the Lutherans of Wantagh came together and rechristened the chapel as the home of Christ Lutheran Church. Just eight years later, in 1934, the plot of land on Island and Church Roads was purchased to build a Sanctuary fit for a growing congregation. And the rest, they say... is history!

PROPERTY REPORT – MAY 2022

Our **Aging Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and improvement items on the "Office" To-Do list that we can accomplish ourselves and those issues we uncover by inspection.

Our recent activities have included:

- We have completed our **Sanctuary area project to convert all the florescent fixtures to LED.** We are very grateful to **Billy Carman** for the loan of Scaffolding to assist us in the Sanctuary, with the higher fixtures, and to **Craig Sparke** for using our 18' ladder and working to convert the highest third tier lights. We have submitted the paperwork to PSEGLI and we expect to receive a **\$1,771 Rebate** shortly. We also scrapped remaining **270 pounds of Ballasts** and received \$49. We searched the property for any **remaining florescent tubes** to discard at the next TOH "Stop" program date.
- The main floor **women's room sink**, previously with the mixing valve issue, failed to operate, but when tapped, operated but would not shut off. We tested and determined the new problem was in the **controller** (**sticky solenoid**) and replaced it with the one from a spare unit. We contacted the vendor and they sent us a replacement for the future.
- A **leak reported by the organ/piano** is being addressed professionally.
- We monitored the "Ant" trap issue in the Education building.
- We straightened and re-braced the Shrub next to the Rm. 2000 entrance.
- We arranged for the overgrown **parsonage front shrubs** to be removed. We purchased and **spread mulch and fertilized** to complete the job. We tied-up and will monitor the dwarf's growth to see if they improve.
- We took the Flower Stands, Crown and Cross, and Tennebrae Candles from storage for Easter week.
- We identified a cracked fan pulley on the North Roof unit and replaced it after obtaining a new one. We also replaced the limit switch sensor.
- We taped a **cracked stair tread edge** in the education building.
- We replaced a bad Thrift Shop fixture LED bulb.
- We purchased and replaced the **lockset on the Pastor's office door,** which was broken. We also replaced the **office 2 lockset**, for aesthetics.
- We moved and re-set some **parking lot "Concrete Bumpers"**, displaced by the plow, back onto their anchoring pins.

- * Investigate the Education Building telephone intercom feature for erradic operation or replace the system.
- * Cleanup and clean out the shop area, Room 100, and the rear Shed area.
- * Gather and discard all the "old" latex paint for the next "STOP" date.
- * Investigate and strengthen the **Altar screen Filigree panels** which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.
- * Remove the old florescent tubes to the next TOH "Stop" date.
- * Purchase and replace the seven (7) old light covers in the Loggia.

Research for Potential Projects

- * Research/Report on the possibility of Siding on the 10/20 building.
- *Research the installation of white vinyl ornate trim covering (Pilasters/Door Surrounds) in the **front area outside the Sanctuary** in lieu of continuous peeling and painting.
- * Research the possibility of new lighting for the Sanctuary.
- * Research the replacement of the wine stained Altar Carpeting.
- *Research extending the **lawn sprinklers** to cover the East side of Steinbicker **after grass restoration**.
- * Research the possibility and costs to **refurbish the Original Steeple Bell** and Cradle.
