

This Mother's Day, Let God Change the Narrative

In the first week of May, the marketing messages leveled at moms grow louder and more insistent. Their central memo? "Because you deserve it." Mom blogs and Instagram posts, including those based in faith, read something like this: after an entire year of drinking lukewarm coffee and eating leftovers off your kids' plates, today you're entitled to put your feet up, pour yourself a glass of wine, and be pampered. At 13 years of motherhood, I can unequivocally say I get it. Motherhood is lived in the daily, ordinary, often-unappreciated tasks that may go unnoticed by your children or your spouse. A day off from the routine and 24 hours of appreciation sound unbelievably perfect. By no means am I dismissing breakfast in bed or unwinding at a spa as a special treat on Mother's Day. And yet it's not what we do or don't do on Mother's Day that counts as much as our heart posture toward this yearly event.

Many moms have succumbed to the social-media trap, convinced that their significance is somehow diminished because their families didn't create Instagram-worthy Mother's Day experiences. In a world driven by likes, shares, and cherry-picked photographs, "I deserve that, too" can breed a sense of resentment and jealousy, or even one-upmanship. It can lead to unrealistic expectations of our spouses or our children. With these unmet (and usually unexpressed) expectations comes a sense of disappointment, which the Enemy exploits to create friction in our relationships with our loved ones. Self-righteous indignation can slowly take over our thinking. To be sure, Scripture does encourage us to work with a reward in mind, a much greater reward than what we could ever receive here and now (Col. 3:23). But a culture of entitlement in our families can promote a sense of working for earthly rewards and recognition—a far inferior joy. It was the very first mother, Eve, who demonstrated the grave folly of believing she deserved more than what God had given her. In her attempt to be "like God" (Gen. 3:5), she lacked contentment and gratitude for what she had already been given—"every tree of the garden" (Gen. 2:16). Deceived by the serpent, she found herself wanting more, deserving more (Gen. 3:1–5).

On Mother's Day, it's all too easy to embrace the marketing mantras that we are entitled to feel significant and worthy through elaborate displays of appreciation. Instead of believing these messages (intentionally or otherwise), we need to hear God's message through the prophet Jeremiah: "My people have committed two evils: they have forsaken me, the fountain of living waters, and hewed out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water" (Jer. 2:13). When we bank on Mother's Day gifts and gestures as a means of fueling our sense of worth, we're left void, depleted, and parched. We forget the true source of our value and satisfaction, which never runs dry—the One who tells us: "I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. . . . Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you" (Isa. 43:3–4). In Christ, we have a greater source of worth than the greatest of Mother's Day bounties.

As Christian mothers, holding onto the ideal of earned worth through our work sits at odds with our faith. We don't earn the blessings God freely pours into our lives. Every good and perfect gift comes from our generous heavenly Father (James 1:17). It's from the fullness of his grace we receive one blessing after another (John 1:16)—not from the rewards we believe are owed us. This doesn't mean we should stop celebrating Mother's Day. Appreciating the mothers and mother figures in our lives is a good and right thing (Ex. 20:12). But what if we flipped the "I deserve" narrative on its head and allowed God to deeply impress on our hearts that every gift in our lives is wholly and completely an outpouring of his grace? That we have laundry to fold, dinner tables to set, and beds to make is an undeserved blessing from God. That we have children to raise, minister to, and share the Word with is an undeserved blessing from God. That we are equipped with grit and grace for this calling of motherhood is an undeserved blessing from God. When we understand just how undeserving we are and yet how much we've received, we're filled with a deep awe and a holy reverence for God. From this fullness we can take our eyes off ourselves and turn them toward Jesus (Heb. 12:2). From this fullness we're freed from self-righteous pride and simmering discontent as we live out our calling—even when our work goes unnoticed. From this fullness we're empowered to serve as the living water of God's Spirit flows through us rather than trying to pour out from broken cisterns (John 7:38; Jer. 2:13).

This Mother's Day, may we let God change the narrative in our minds from "I deserve" to "Even though I don't deserve." May we remember that while Mother's Day rolls around once a year, we have the stunning privilege of celebrating the undeserved grace of being daughters of the King every single day.



"They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them." - Acts 2:3-4

On **Sunday, May 28**, we will celebrate the Festival Day of Pentecost. The Liturgical color for Pentecost is **red.** The color red symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit given to the Disciples, which fueled the beginnings of the Church. **This year, the Worship & Music Committee will continue our tradition of adorning the Sanctuary with red geraniums.** Geranium memorials will be printed in the Pentecost bulletin. Following the service, the geraniums will be planted in our Church gardens.



PROPERTY REPORT – MAY 2023

Our recently reduced Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement from the "Office" To-Do list, or that we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- Low heat on the North end of the Sanctuary had us on the roof once again. Having previously Replaced/Adjusted belts, aligned, and tightened a loose and wobbling fan pulley, we were surprised to see the belt off once again. Upon closer inspection, we discovered a "Split" fan pulley to be the problem. We ordered a replacement and aligned the pulleys before replacing the Belt and adjusting the tension. We also adjusted the fans speed for optimized blowing strength.
- Tightened loose "play furniture" items in a couple of Nursery school classroom.
- Responded to a **"Smoking"** power strip in the Parish Administrator's area. We replaced the strip and cautioned against using any Electrical Heating devices.
- We responded to a "No heat" situation on the main floor of the Education Building. Investigation revealed that due to the excessive heat in Della's area the Floor's thermostat prevented the rest of the floor's heat to activate automatically all week.
- On a recent Saturday, we uncovered the "Split A/C unit" in Pastor's office pumping heat up over 80 Deg! We replaced the remote's batteries and shut it down. On another early Tuesday visit; we uncovered the Treasure's office "Split A/C unit" pumping heat over 80 Deg! Upon investigation, we found the timer set to activate at 8AM daily! We have since reset all three Split A/C units for manual operation and revisited the office heating guidelines with those involved. We also reprogrammed all the property's thermostats for the daily and weekend occupancy needs. Please note: Never place a thermostat on "permanent" hold.
- We checked, re-tightened, and repaired, as needed, all the Sanctuary side Toilet seats, TP holders, and the Faucets for proper operation.
- We initiated a cleanout and organization of the office "Property Drawer".
- We re-taped a damaged stair tread "Bull Nose" edge to prevent problems.
- We Surveyed the Gym Kitchen and Bathroom for and leaks or issues.
- We installed new "Door stops" on the lower Ed Building Bathroom doors.
- We re-secured a dislodged "handle set problem" on a lower classroom door.
- We temporarily changed the corner signboard for the 10AM Services.
- We assisted with the Easter Week preparations. Hooks, Banners, Stands, Etc.
- We investigated a rear yard "Gate" and "lock" issue after a report to the police involving the Landscaper entry for their Spring clean up. Found all secure.
- An "old" fence connector issue was reconnected, and parsonage rear gate adjusted.
- We sprayed the Floor/wall seam in the Steinbicker boiler room with "Flex seal".
- We continued a cleanout and straightening up of the lower .Boiler room/Shop area,
- We re-secured and "Flex sealed" the front sanctuary gutter.
- We re-secured a "hanging" Ed Building ceiling light cover.

* Cleanup and clean out the lower shop area. (WKG)

* Prepare the Christmas window spotlights for next year. (WKG)

* Investigate and strengthen the Altar screen Filigree panels which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.

* Prepare and paint the Education building's Front entrance trim.

* Touch-up the Room 10/20 trim, missed by the painters and paint the new flagpole-light socket.

* Prepare/paint the rusting "Loggia-Yard" steel doorframe and door.

* Re-paint the "Blue Drop-Off" curbs.

* Prepare/paint all the steel window header mantles on the Sanctuary building.

* Prepare/paint the Room 2000 back door frame and rear shed frame.

* Spray additional "Flex-Seal" on the Southeast and South wall bases of the Ed. Building to prevent further leakage. (CMPLT)

* Re-spray the rusting south rooftop A/C Ducts with Aluminum Rustoleum ©.

* Investigate and tighten all loose toilet seat covers. (CMPLT)

* Install new Doorstops on the lower bathroom doors. (CMPLT)

* Re-secure and waterproof (Flexseal) the front Sanctuary Gutter. (CMPLT)


