PROPERTY REPORT – SEPT 2021

Our **Small Aging Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and improvement items on the To-Do list that we can accomplish ourselves.

Our activities recently have included:

- We modified a new thrift shop cart to help in moving things around.
- We replaced a few Fluorescents on the education buildings main floor and reset others not functioning in the hot/humid weather. We changed the bulbs in the Sanctuary dark **screen light**, restoring the light. We Changed/reset three in room 10.
- We initiated the **painting of the Wrought Iron railings** as weather and traffic permits. The entrances at Room 2000, Sanctuary, Thrift Shop, and Steinbicker are complete. The "Pit" stair railings will be done before NS begins. We cemented a few wobbly stanchions into the walkways.
- Following the <u>discovery of "whitish spots"</u> on the bottoms of many Sanctuary chairs stacked in room 2000, we also uncovered others in the Loggia and the Sanctuary itself. We cleaned them with simple green and wipes and they seem to be clearing up. We completed the Sanctuary chairs when the NS was finished. Our analysis points to contributing factors of **damp weather clothes racks and lack of A/C need** for weekday activities and Sunday coffee hours. We reprogrammed the sanctuary A/C's to come on for a half hour a day Mo-Sa to ward off a reoccurrence.
- We reprogrammed the **Sanctuary A/C's** again after VBS changes. We restored the **fan belt on the North unit,** which had slipped off the pulley.
- We re-secured two "Screen light" covers that fell off in the Organ Speaker loft.
- We activated the **De-Humidifier in the Parsonage basement**. When it did not work, we ordered and installed a new one. We also replaced a chirping S/D battery.
- We ordered **2-new De-Humidifiers for the Steinbicker basement** after finding them not functioning. We removed the old units from their hallway shelves and moved them to the driveway for special pickup. We installed the new units.
- With difficulty, we TWICE moved the large 18' A-ladder into the sanctuary to replace numerous high ceiling bulbs. One bad ballast was found and a new one was ordered. We thank Craig for making the change over to the new ballast.
- We had to cut off a rusted lock to get to the 18' ladder, so we ordered **three new locks**, and got extra keys made, for the rear yard Gates and 18' Ladder.
- We thank Bob Hasteadt for purchasing a Solar/motion pole light for the parking lot. We mounted it high on the entrance pole and trimmed bushes for better coverage. Bob had to return it when it got "flooded", and we mounted the new one.
- We cut the July 4th marching banner pole to fit the new banner.
- The corner power pole at Island and Wantagh is finally gone. The last of our neighborhood's critical power/telephone/cable services were transferred to new poles, just prior to the Parade, and after 4-years of our coaxing. Our thanks to the TOH for their escalation assistance. We installed a new pole "Hanger" for the Thrift shop sign.
- We **dried** the Steinbicker north **basement floor**, **flooded** following the 7/9 deluge.

- We surveyed and discussed the parsonage refurbishment and provided an extensive document to the Transition team for consideration.
- We uncovered a clogged condenser screen with no filter in the **Room 2000 A/C**.
- After scraping the thick fuzz off, vacuuming, and restoring the flattened vanes, the A/C was working fine. We **thank Bob Hasteadt** for purchasing a new foam filter.
- We cleaned the **Thrift Shop A/C filter** and vacuumed the condenser, restoring the full A/C capability.
- We disassembled and tightened up a couple of loose/wobbly Altar Platform Chairs.
- We restored (with tape, tie wraps, and hulas hoops) **the collapsed NS yard canopy**, needing another two days summer program use. We also made it stronger to hopefully carry them through September.
- As requested, we moved a file cabinet from the Pastors office into the Youth room.
- We installed new sliding parts in a lower classroom vinyl window sash.

- *We are still awaiting the findings and recommendations from the property wide "energy survey" by a PSEG contractor.
- *We are happy that "Best Buy" finally FIXED the Parsonage Ice issue.

^{*}Clean the ceiling light covers in room 10 and 2000.

^{*}Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.

^{*}Power Wash the front Steinbicker stairway, north 10-20 wall, etc "greens",

^{*}Scrape and Paint the white/bare trim above the Library and 2000 kitchenette.

^{*}Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit?, Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor.

^{*}Repair numerous **Cement issues** around the property. (Stairs, Pointing, Washes, loose items, price professional intervention?).

^{*}Prepare/Paint the outside **Room 20 North window** frame (Professional?).

^{*}Clean and refurbish the vinyl replacement windows all around, checking for smooth operation, weather stripping and locking capability. (WKG)

^{*}Research and arrange for a "Seal coating" and re-striping of the parking lot and the Parsonage driveway. (Fall?)
