### Dear Friends,

Doesn't it seem like we just put the Christmas decorations away? Fast forward, and we are just a few weeks away from the Fourth of July Parade. Yet here we are, 31 months after Pastor Nale retired. Throughout this time, we have been served by many dedicated pastors who have helped our congregation maintain a small sense of normalcy. I get asked often when we can expect to have a permanent pastor again. If I knew the answer to that question, I would probably be working in Albany or Washington D.C.

At the Synod Assembly, I heard Bishop Egensteiner tell the audience that only about four percent of candidates seeking a call are interested in coming to New York. The greatest concern seems to be the high cost of living in the Metropolitan New York area for a young family. The number of men and women attending seminary is also lower than it has been in the past. But instead of feeling a sense of pessimism, I was reassured that a candidate for our vacancy is not that far away. I have no reason to doubt that.

Our congregation has always had a sense of mission beyond our four walls on Church Road. Our Annual Country Fair raises money for a variety of charitable causes, locally, regionally and nationally. Of the nearly 200 congregations of the Metropolitan New York Synod, our congregation ranked number ten in Mission Support giving. On Mother's Day and Father's Day, many of us contribute to important charitable causes through the church. It's all a part of who we are. We can be proud that we don't concern ourselves only with our wants and needs, but care about so many vital ministries that value our help.

Where do we stand currently? We hope to have a candidate for the Call Committee to consider soon. Until that happens, our pulpit will be filled every Sunday until Rally Day in September. Perhaps we won't need supply pastors through that time, but at least we are prepared in case we do. I encourage you to remain positive about our congregation. Despite some challenging problems during this vacancy, we have been able to weather the storm thus far. Don't get dismayed now.

# What the Reformation Taught Me About Being a Dad

A year ago, the following sentiment is not one I would've predicted I'd be expressing this Father's Day: Martin Luther and the birth and infancy of my second child will always be inextricably linked. I've been on the Living Lutheran staff for seven months—funny enough, my first day was on Reformation Day, Oct. 31. Less than two weeks later, my son was born. (Incidentally, I don't recommend starting a new job and having a kid at the same time.)

Since then I've been immersed in Reformation history and theology, doing research for projects like our Reformation 500 lists as we approach its 500th anniversary. And it's been interesting, and often surprisingly helpful, to track my young son's development and growth as I've simultaneously learned from the reformers.

As I think about the kind of person and dad I want to be, it's not hard to see the ways in which the lessons of Luther and the reformers can apply to our personal and family lives as well as to our public life. These are some of the most valuable lessons I've learned from the example of the Reformation as they've related to fatherhood.

Don't be afraid to think outside the box: Luther, faced with a conviction about the state of the church that he couldn't shake, acted on his principles and challenged the norms of his day and of his position. He didn't settle for the status quo, and used his gifts to think beyond what was expected of him. When my first child was born, although I was thrilled to have a boy, I admit to having had some trepidation at the prospect of a son. I'd imagined myself as a dad of daughters, and I suddenly felt an internal pressure to be a certain kind of father. Was I athletic enough to have a son who might be really enthusiastic about sports? Was I handy enough to teach him to do projects around the house? Was I a good enough man to model manhood? Of course, I quickly realized that those concerns were silly. First, there's no reason why those questions shouldn't also apply to daughters. Second, I've found that the kind of person you are translates into the kind of parent you are, and that parenting successes come when you're being yourself. It's easy to feel a sense of shame at not approaching parenthood the "right" way when reading parenting books and websites. But I believe I'm a better dad to my two sons when I trust my instincts and try not to worry about expectations.

The importance of surrender: Legend has it that Luther decided to leave law school and become a monk when he got caught in a lightning storm. On the spot, he vowed to join the monastic life if God would spare him from the storm; he kept his word and entered the monastery shortly thereafter. Whether or not all the details of this event are true, there's no doubt that a consistent theme throughout the lives of Luther and the reformers was surrendering to God's will, and putting a bigger cause ahead of their own comfort. My journey to fatherhood was initially a little rocky. My wife and I both knew we wanted to have kids, but as a highly sensitive, introverted Enneagram type nine, I had great anxiety about the disruption that children would cause to the way life looked for us, pre-kids. With the help of a counselor, I was able to start implementing one of the most transformative spiritual practices I've encountered: trying to actively surrender and give up (the illusion of) control. Throughout pregnancy, labor and parenthood, surrender has been the mantra my wife and I have returned to over and over. And by taking that posture, I've been able to enjoy my role as a dad more than any other I've had.

The joy of holistic vocation: The idea of vocation was foundational to the Reformation. Luther and the reformers espoused the notion of living out our faith in all the roles we're called to—at work, in ministry and with family. A natural outgrowth of this holistic vision was that the intimacy and fun of family and home life often permeated the reformers' work and ministry as well. Luther knew the importance of fun, and famously enjoyed conversations about life and theology at the dinner table with friends and family—over beer he and his wife Katharina von Bora brewed—that went late into the night. "Work-life balance" is something all parents struggle with, but with a toddler, a new baby and a new job, I felt that tension especially tangibly. Still, when new or expecting parents have asked me one thing I would tell them about parenthood, I usually say something I hadn't heard much when I was wrestling with becoming a dad: it's fun. Maybe it seems obvious, but I wasn't expecting to have as much fun as I do with my boys. Of course, every day as a parent brings a range of emotions (and it certainly isn't always the word on the tip of my tongue), but more often than not, fatherhood is a fun adventure for me. May that be so in the way we approach and live out our faith in all areas of our lives.

# **PROPERTY REPORT – JUNE 2023**

**Our Volunteer Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or that we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- We initiated a cleanout and organization of the **office "Property Drawer"**.
- We continued a cleanout and straightening up of the lower Boiler room/Shop area,
- We responded to a "Bad Water"/"Smell" report in the library, and causing reduced plant life. We found the water, same as our coffee hour, to be fine.
- We "Belt Sanded" and tightened the sticking LH door on the Thrift Shop shed.
- We changed the Three (3) **Flagpole spots to LED's** on hand, and adjusted the aim.
- We adjusted the "Pit" Motion unit preventing false activations by Car lights and moved the front and side garage motion units to prevent false activations.
- We completed a project to install new "manual" Bathroom soap dispensers in all the bathrooms, and "soap catchers" underneath, in select Nursery School ones.
- We adjusted the outside Steinbicker **spotlight timer** for increased day light.
- We **re-glued the step pads** on the stairway to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Bathroom and numerous **floor tiles** in the education building.
- We **deactivated the winter freeze lamps**, replacing a halogen bulb, ready for next year. We also deactivated the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor heater and placed the shovels and snowmelt back into storage. **We serviced the Snow Blower** for storage and uncovered and activated the Rm10 Men's room fan. We connected and activated the **hoses**.
- We responded to an Altar microphone issue and **found one switch turned off**.
- We installed an Altar guild cabinet "top extension" for better banner stability.
- We drilled holes in many yard toys to drain and eliminate water accumulation.
- We installed a **new GFCI power outlet and "battery eliminator"** in the room 10 men's room to eliminate the hands free faucet battery changes.
- We checked, tightened, and lubricated all the hardware in all the Kitchen Cabinets.
- We tightened the mountings on numerours Hands free faucets.
- We **performed a security check in the Parsonage** and turned the thermostat off.
- We repaired the broken gate in the Parsonage rear yard to parking lot fence.
- We painted the Loggia-rear yard steel door frame.
- We activated the lawn sprinklers and controllers, replacing a contractor damaged section adjacent the Parsonage porch and a broken rotory head by the driveway apron. We WD40'd numerous sticky heads.
- We activated the **Roftop A/C units**, changed filters and adjusted the belts.
- We sprayed the rusting roof top ducts, with aluminum Rustoleum ©.
- We put air in the thrift shop cart tires.
- We **removed two dead shrubs** adjacent the Sanctuary and Room 2000 windows and placed them at the curb for P/U.

- We restored the Altar railing and touched-up Sanctuary furniture and piano dings.
