

Dear Friends,

Half of the year is complete. A lot has been accomplished, but there is more yet to be done in the second half of the year. At the June Church Council meeting, I was able to report that the work on the parsonage was completed. The last items on the punch list were completed by our contractor on June 9th. Bishop Egensteiner was with us on May 22nd to bless the newly renovated parsonage, and we also celebrated Pr. Nale's and Elaine DiChiara's retirements after a long pandemic delay. On June 5th, Pr. Christopher Mietlowski led us in worship as five young members of our congregation received their First Communion.

Members of the congregation continue to work quietly to get rid of the clutter that has accumulated over the years as we prepare for the arrival of a new pastor. Each Sunday we are fortunate enough to be led in worship by veteran pastors who help keep us moving towards filling our pastoral vacancy.

One issue that was resolved at the last meeting of the Church Council was improving our security, especially as it relates to our nursery school. This issue has been discussed over the last several months. During those months, we have heard almost on a daily basis, another shooting taking place in a school, a Church, a shopping mall and other public places. Those new security guidelines that were approved by the Council are included in this Spire. We hope that you will understand that these measures were taken to protect those that are in our building, especially the two-, three- and four-year-olds that come to our Church every weekday. It will take some getting used to. We hope that you will cooperate with these new procedures, because without your cooperation, this will not work. The Church Council also approved consulting with a security specialist to determine how we can make our property more secure with the use of technology. That process is currently in progress.

The annual 4th of July parade is but days away. Make sure to look for the Christ Lutheran float as it moves up Wantagh Avenue or as it passes in front of Steinbicker Hall. Thanks to all who have participated and to those of you cheering everyone on.

Enjoy the lazy, hazy days of summer. See you in Church.

Christ Lutheran Church Security Plan

Steinbicker Hall:

- 1. A camera doorbell will be installed. Any staff or volunteers present will be able to see who is at the door by looking at monitor in the Church office (to be installed in the near future).
- 2. ALL persons MUST ring the doorbell be let in during school hours.
- 3. They must then sign in at the Church Office. They will be given a laminated pass to be in the building. People will also need to sign out when they leave.
- 4. NO ELECTIVE work is to be done in Steinbicker or on the playground during school hours. This means that the Pastor, the Parish Administrator, the Nursery School Director, the Teachers and the students are to be the ONLY people present in the building during school hours unless otherwise approved.
- 5. If EMERGENCY work needs to be done during school hours (such as a clogged toilet), then only people relating to the work will be allowed to be present.
- 6. The front door of Steinbicker is to remain locked and closed during school hours.
- 7. The door in the pass through (aka loggia) to the Sanctuary and the library will be bolted and locked during school hours as well.
- 8. If the Nursery School needs to use the Sanctuary (such as rehearsals, pageants or graduation), the Nursery School Director will inform the Parish Administrator. In turn, she will send an email to the entire congregation to inform them. The Sanctuary will be a de facto Nursery School those days, and NO ONE else should be in the Sanctuary.
- 9. If volunteers come in to work on projects when school is in session, such as folding the bulletins or the Spire, that work will be done in Room 2000. The Parish Administrator will see that all needed items are accounted for in Room 2000.
- 10. If ANYONE is working in the church office, all office doors are to be kept unlocked.
- 11. IF the Parish Administrator is absent for any reason, we will attempt to provide some coverage. (a plan is being worked on)

Sanctuary:

- 1. The Narthex door to Rooms 10 and 20 is to remain locked. If the door is opened for use by the Thrift Shop, it is the responsibility of the Thrift Shop staff to lock the door at the end of the day.
- 2. The last person to leave the church is to lock the doors, and make sure that BOTH doors are closed and locked.

Throughout the Church Property:

- 1. All doors are to be checked and locked daily at the end of the day. A security check will be done by the Parish Administrator prior to the of their shift
- 2. Pending the approval by the church council, cameras will be installed at selected entrances/exits of the property. Monitors for these cameras will be located in the Church Office. (to be installed in the near future).
- 3. Gates to the playground should remain closed at all times.

Upon approval by the church council, these security guidelines will be implemented. These guidelines are subject to change, as the situation warrants. Any changes must be presented to the church council for their consideration and approval.

A PRAYER FOR UNITY



As we celebrate our nation's independence, let us reflect on these words from the "All Creation Sings" hymnal:

Rekindle among us the gift of your Spirit so that we seek to live in **unity with all people**, breaking down the walls that divide, ending the hostility among us, and proclaiming peace to those who are near and to those who are far away; through Christ Jesus, in whom we all have access in the one Spirit to you, both now and forever. Amen."

DID YOU KNOW...

- ★ Paul Revere's famous "one if by land, two if by sea" signal, which heralded the arrival of British troops and the start of the Revolutionary War, was made from the steeple of a Boston Church.
- ★ The Battle of Springfield, in 1780, was the last major battle in the North. American troops neared disaster when they ran out of the paper wadding needed to load their guns. A Presbyterian minister, James Caldwell, ran to his Church, and brought back a pile of old hymnals to use. The patriots went on to win the battle.
- ★ Major General Peter Muhlenberg, the son of a prominent Lutheran minister and a Pastor himself, ripped off his clerical robes after one of his Sermons to reveal the uniform of the Virginia militia. He was one of many "fighting parsons," as they were called; clerical men who took up arms, and who preached that fighting against a tyrannical government was a righteous cause. Muhlenberg went on to command one of the brigades at the Battle of Yorktown, before retiring with distinction in 1783.



PROPERTY REPORT – JULY 2022

Our **Aging Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and improvement items on the "Office" To-Do list, that we can accomplish ourselves and those issues we uncover.

Our recent activities have included:

- The leak that was reported near the organ/piano under the flat roof area has been resolved after the Roofer's extensive work on, around, and under the ductwork and re-roofing a 20X20 section under the South A/C unit, which required raising the A/C unit to get the material underneath, and sealed. (PIM \$8,360)
- We wish to thank "**Optimus Primers**", a Wantagh Chamber of Commerce partner for their generous donation of the paint and Labor to power wash the Parsonage and refinish the Shutters and lamppost.
- We fabricated a new part for, and **reactivated** the **top latch** on the **Loggia/Sanctuary door.** We also **installed a new latch** on the Loggia side to enable the Nursery School to activate their school time security procedures. We touched up the door paint. We also **reversed the door lock on the library door,** preventing access to the loggia except by a key, again for the NS security issue.
- We activated the Thrift Shop and Room 2000 wall A/C units.
- We repaired a leaking sight glass washer on the Room 2000 coffee pot.
- We **re-secured the loose railing** posts on the thrift shop porch with hydraulic cement.
- We initiated a "major" clean out of the rear yard storage shed, Rehanging many items, Re-imagining an old shelving unit, Removing trash to the garbage, Moving "Fair" items to the Gym, and repairing the heavy sliding door to operate smoothly and easily.
- We uncovered "Sewage" spraying from the south wall Vent pipe on the education building. The Sewer Rooter Company cleared the paper/roots in about two hours, and the bathrooms were opened in time for Nursery School, the next morning. (PIM\$1,848)
- We replaced a missing tilt window bracket in a lower NS classroom.
- We repaired <u>an unreported</u> broken door check on a lower NS classroom pit door and re-secured all the other "Pit" door checks.
- We installed a locking door handle on the rear Parsonage Garage door.

THINGS TO DO

*Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.

*Power Wash the front Steinbicker, north 10-20 wall, etc "greens", *Scrape and Paint the white/bare trim above the Library and 2000

kitchenette.

*Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit?, Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor.

*Repair numerous **Cement issues** around the property. (Stairs, Pointing, Washes, loose items, price professional intervention?) (**Summer Break?**)

*Prepare/Paint the outside **Room 20 North window** frame. **(\$\$\$Wkg?).** ***Research and arrange** for a "Seal coating" and re-striping of the parking lot and the Parsonage driveway. **(\$\$\$Wkg?-Summer Break?)**

* Touch up **Roof top A/C duct "Rust spots"** with Aluminum paint.

* Investigate the Education Building telephone intercom feature for erradic operation or replace the system.

* Cleanup and clean out the lower shop area, and Room 100.

* Cleanup and clean out the rear Shed area. (CMPLT)

* Gather and discard all the "old" latex paint for the next "STOP" date.

* Investigate and strengthen the Altar screen Filigree panels which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.

Research for Potential Projects

* Research/Report on the possibility of **Siding on the 10/20 building**. *Research the installation of white vinyl ornate trim covering (Pilasters/Door Surrounds) in the **front area outside the Sanctuary** in lieu of continuous peeling and painting.

* Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary**.

* Research the replacement of the wine stained Altar Carpeting.

*Research extending the **lawn sprinklers** to cover the East side of Steinbicker **after grass restoration**.

* Research the possibility and costs to refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.
