New Business:

- **Church Sound System:** Council approved an estimate and a budget for upgrades to the church's sound system. This project will be coordinated with **Music Trends**.
- **Altar Carpet:** Council approved preliminary plans for the church altar carpet to be replaced. WELCA will contribute funding to cover the full cost of this project.
- **Eagle Scout Project:** Council approved an Eagle Scout project proposal for the design of a media space in Room 10, which includes a smart TV and whiteboards.

Nursery Board:

- **Enrollment:** 79 students are currently enrolled.
- **Registration:** In-house registration for the 2024-2025 school year will be held on Wednesday, January 10th.
- **Holiday Recess:** The School will be closed Monday, December 25th-Monday, January 1st.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- **Sunday School:** We are so proud of all our students who participated in the Christmas Pageant. We had so much fun working together and learning our Christmas songs. At the end of the Pageant, students were gifted Christmas goodie bags and enjoyed some festive cookies during Coffee Hour. **Sunday School will not meet on December 24th or 31st. We will return on January 7th.**

PROPERTY REPORT – JAN 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the “Office” To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our **recent activities** have included:

- We **drained and charged two Expansion tanks in the Ed Building boiler room.**
- We investigated the **Sanctuary Boiler room Expansion tank** to identify a means to drain. It has never had any maintenance, since installation. Calling Quinn.
- We completed, the ELCA lawn tree Christmas lights, and Manger figures..
- We placed the **North Sanctuary Wreath.**
- We **thank the Scout organizations** for the November yard cleanup. We were happily surprised to find the **50-60 leaf bags** gone when we went to place them at the curb for the Wednesday P/U. The Scouts had put them out for Tuesday.
- We prepared for Advent/Christmas by activating the **Flower stands** and the **Advent Wreath** and filled the Advent and rear Candles with oil.
- We got a start on the Christmas Season by assembling and placing the **“New” Sanctuary tree with Star** and the heavy wrought iron back candle stands, as well as the Entrance door light bars on the timer. We **removed the Christmas items from the old Choir Loft and Christmas closet** and set-up the platform and Front Manger figures, Put up the Wreaths on the windows, the North Wall decorations, and installed the Stairway Garland/Lights.
- We activated the anti-freeze lamps in and under the 10/20 stairway area.
- At a neighbor’s request, we adjusted the side **Parsonage Garage motion light** to reduce shining into the rear house bedroom.
- We placed new **cricket traps** in the boiler rooms and shed areas.
- A Split off Peach Tree Branch was cut it by **Craig** and prepared it for TOH P/U.
- We removed “Mr. Mittens” and the “Seafarer’s Box” to choir loft storage.
- Following the landscaper’s final cleanup (MCJ 379-6506), we installed the newly rewired **outside window spotlights** for use on **Christmas Eve.**
- When the **first Advent Candle** refused to light, we investigated and determined that a new **Wick** was required BUT after filling to the proper level, all was good. We will still replace all the wicks after Advent.
- We replaced a broken Sanctuary-**Loggia Door Stop** and rubber rubber tip.
- We set the Sanctuary Thermostats for Wednesday Choir rehearsal heat. We also set the room 2000 thermostat for Wednesday Choir, Thursday Technology, Friday Thrift Shop, and specials such as WELCA, Thrift Shop Christmas Party, Council Meeting, etc... **NOTE: it is NEVER acceptable to place a thermostat on HOLD! “USE THE ARROWS” up/down to handle all special heating needs if not programmed. Tell us when you need heat so we can program it for you.**
- We set the basement Thermostat for school time schedule.
- We activated the Parsonage heat and met the Liberty Meter Changer.

RESEARCH FOR POTENTIAL LONG RANGE PROJECTS

- * Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary.**
- * Research a possible upgrade to the Sanctuary sound system.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the Education Building Main Floor Bathrooms.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the two Room 10 Bathrooms.
- * Research replacing the rear yard Stairway cover.
- * Research the possibility and costs to remove and **refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.**
- * Research installing AirConditioning in the main Ed. Building classrooms.(Wkg)
- * Investigate installing a pole for power to the far Parking lot area for **Security.**

MISCELLANEOUS THINGS STILL NEEDING WORK

- * Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.
- * Repair numerous **Cement issues.** (Back walk, Pit wall, Pointing, Washes)
- * Price **professional intervention** to repair a **rear yard** broken and sinking **sidewalk square. !!!**
- * Investigate and strengthen the **Altar screen Filigree panels** which are **showing signs of looseness and cracking.**
- * **Power Wash** the “Greens”, especially on the Sheds beyond the parking lot.
- * Re-Seal the old office Duct Work to eliminate winter drafts.
- * Check for **loose stair treads** on the Room 10 and 20 stairways and re-glue.
- * **Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker.** Stones to pit? Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. Extend the Sprinkler system into to the area.
- * Rebuild, once again, the rotting Front Sanctuary Planter Boxes.
- * Complete the Painting of the Thrift Shop incoming shed.
- * **Replace the Parsonage/Parking Lot “Post and Rail” fencing.**
- * Check/reset coverage of the flagpole Sprinkler head. Zone 1/North of walkway.
- * Touch-up the “Rust areas” on the outside fire escape.
- * Drain and charge the two Education Building **boiler Expansion tanks.(CMPLT)**
- * **Replace the water damaged ceiling tiles in the lower “east” bathroom.**
- * Replace the Parsonage Water shut off valves with Ball valves. Liberty/Quinn
(WKG)
- * Clean-out the “High” gutters on the East side of the Education Building. **(WKG)**
- * Investigate draining the Expansion tank in the Sanctuary Boiler room.**(WKG)**
- * Lubricate the bearings on the Gym South loft exhaust fan. Vacuum the grill.
- * Lubricate the Casters on the Gym Chair and Table racks.
- * Arrange for new carpeting in the Altar area, WELCA Project.
