




COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

PROPERTY REPORT – FEB 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- We activated the Room 30 wall heater to reduce a freeze situation.
- We completed the Christmas Decorations with the Rear Candles and bows, and the Bell stand garlands.
- We replaced all the Advent Candle Wicks after Advent.
- We repaired a Nursery School "drying rack".
- NOTE: it is NEVER acceptable to place a thermostat on HOLD! "USE THE ARROWS" up/down to handle all special heating needs if not programmed. Tell us when you need heat so we can program it for you.
- We replaced the broken blind in the lower slop sink/storage area and installed a new one in the adjacent classroom.
- We replaced a broken slat in a main floor east-side classroom.
- We lubricated all the Chair caddies in the Gym and Thrift Shop carts.
- We replaced the broken Sanctuary window Spotlight switch and removed the spotlights to Loft storage after Christmas.
- We fabricated and stained a Bell music table riser.
- We vacuumed, cleaned the filter, and winterized the Thrift Shop A/C unit.
- We re-filled all the Rear and Altar Candles after Christmas.
- We monitored the **Ed. Building Gutter Cleaning (PIM \$600)** which eliminated the flooding issue.
- We replaced the batteries in the Thrift Shop Thermostat.
- We "properly" stored the candlelight cups and candles for next year.
- We removed much spilled candle wax from numerous Sanctuary Chairs.
- We called "Liberty Water" to identify/test the street valve for needed Parsonage plumbing work. We will have Quinn, the plumber (826-3253), repair/replace the Meter valves in the near future.
- We removed all of the Sanctuary Christmas Decorations, packed and boxed everything and returned them to storage. We also removed the lawn manger figures and ELCA tree lights and moved them to storage. We checked and packed all the tree lights ready for next year. We thank Bob Hasteadt for purchasing some LEDs to supplement our lights next year.
- We repaired a dislodged and bent overhead door bracket on **the Ed Bldg entrance**.
- We removed and spread Snowmelt for the first "Snow" from the steps and walkways.
