## THRIFT SHOP

## CHRISTIAN OUTREACH

**Seafarers:** Thank you to all who contributed to the Seafarers Christmas at Sea care satchels. A total of 119 satchels were donated. We also thank our friends at LuHi and the Pioneers for their generosity and hard work in this joint project.

## THRIVENT FINANCIAL

Our congregation's contribution to the annual Christmas at Sea Program was a great success. We received enough donations to put together 119+ satchels (containing hoodie sweatshirts, t-shirts, socks, scarves, knit hats, snacks, and personal Christmas greetings) to give to Rev. Marsh Luther Drege, Executive Director of Seafarers International House (SIH). The SUV he drove from SIH got stuffed to the gunwales. The satchels are a way for Pastor Drege to introduce the seamen to his ministry when he distributes them onboard the ships during the holidays. This project is one of the many ways the Seafarers' International House, a Lutheran ministry, supports visiting seamen who spend long periods away from home. We would like to thank Thrivent for the seed money to this Action Team project.



The congregation of CLC was generous in their support with their donations of cash and goods. In addition, the Pioneers, a charitable organization of phone company retirees (one of whom is a CLC member), contributed and assembled numerous satchels for us. Students at LuHi also assembled a significant number of satchels. The women of WELCA also participated. We would like to thank everybody involved.

In the past, WELCA did not plan for a meeting in January because of the risk of snow or bad weather. After the recent snowstorm and frigid weather, it has been decided that we would postpone the January 7<sup>th</sup> meeting and hold our luncheon later in the year, so stay cozy and safe.


