#### PROPERTY REPORT – APRIL 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help.

#### Our recent activities have included:

- We were unable to remove all the "Wax Stains" from numerous Sanctuary Chairs and found the Fabric (to re-cover) has been discontinued with no remnants to be found anywhere. We swapped the worse chairs to less visible locations. We asked that "DRIPLESS CANDLES" be purchased before the next candlelight service.
- We burnished a dripping Chalice Spout and tightened an Altar Candle wick top.
- We had Quinn, the plumber, come to replace the **Loggia Motor/Pump** located in the Education Building boiler room restoring the heat to this zone. (PIM\$382)
- We recommended and obtained bids to cover the floor tiles, in the lower NS classrooms, with new "Vinyl planking". The Nursery School will schedule installation during the April school break.
- We determined that a new type Window A/C unit could be used in the Nursery School classrooms. This is the less expensive solution to the A/C issue, and addresses the sound and security issues voiced. We thank Roy Stone who has volunteered to install the needed electrical outlets adjacent the windows.
- We sprayed twice more, the residual mold in the Parsonage basement boiler room caused when a pipe valve leaked a few months back. We will Shellac over it when the product is available.
- We re-initiated a **cleanout of the C/E room** emptying and removing three old file cabinets while boxing the contents for others to look at.
- Vinny arranged bids and approval to replace the shattered first floor **Parsonage Shower door**. It was completed by **GCS Glass (516-494-4096)** for \$900 PIM.
- An **Altar platform carpet proposal** received from Carpet Depot was presented to WELCA to pick the color and arrange the replacement. We removed the railings, Pulpit, Altar, and furniture and the job was completed on March 10<sup>th</sup>. We restored everything tightening the altar legs, and re-gluing and screwing the platform chairs.
- We replaced a cracked electrical outlet under the Altar.
- We replaced a few **damaged ceiling tiles** in the lower Ed Bldg bathrooms.
- We re-taped a damaged stairway tread nose on the loggia/Ed Bldg south end.
- We accessed and caulked the **old drafty duct cover** from the counting room.
- We replaced a broken **blind slat** in the counting room.
- We moved numerous book boxes to the curb for the "Book Fairy" pickup.
- We replaced the dim bulbs with bright LEDs in the three Parsonage lamppost lights, repairing one socket. We trimmed the surrounding shrubs for better lighting.
- We cleaned out the "Narthex Usher Closet" disposing of many old unneeded items and old hymnals.
- We cleaned out the old books and hymnals in the Loggia closet for TOH trash.

- We investigated "No Heat" from the south roof top unit and initially found no problem. We tightened the Fan belt but uncovered the heating unit was cutting out after initially running fine. We will call for a service visit.
- We changed all the Wall clocks and Telephones for the time change.
- We extended the front gutter run-off pipe to prevent further sidewalk erosion.
