Dear Friends,

The end of this month brings us to an anniversary that I never thought we would achieve. By the last Sunday of the month we will have reached three years since the retirement of Pastor Nale. There won't be any need for candles or cake to commemorate this auspicious occasion. This vacancy period has been challenging for all of us in many different ways. The Call Committee has met, but has only had two candidates to consider after all of this time. The lack of qualified candidates is evident.

Recently, online ads were placed on Indeed.com and Linked-In. Other online opportunities are being explored, in order to spread our reach as far as possible to find potential candidates for the Bishop Office's consideration. So far none of the respondents were worth any further consideration.

I work with several other churches, some of which are also vacant or are about to become vacant. These congregations are experiencing the same frustrations that we are. Demand far exceeds supply.

In the meantime, we must continue to keep working at what we do best. We must continue to serve the community through the important ministry of the Thrift Shop. We must remain diligent in providing the best education possible through our Nursery School. Even without a regular Pastor, we must continue to educate our young children in Sunday School and prepare them for the future through our Confirmation Program.

One ministry of Christ Lutheran Church that helps us to stand out from other churches is our music ministry. Every supply pastor that we have had over the last three years has commented to me how impressed they have been with our Bell Choir and the Adult Choir and the leadership of Nicole Nicholson. It might be the difference-maker in having a Pastor decide to come to our church.

For the time being, we must remain positive. When we think things can't get any worse, the right candidate might actually come to us. That's what keeps me going.

Worship & Music:

- O Coffee Hour: There are several upcoming Sundays which do not have a Coffee Hour Host. Council determined that cash donations/monies from the Fellowship Fund will be used to purchase the items needed to continue Coffee Hour in the absence of a host. Jan Eastlund will receive the funds for the purchase of these items.
- Service Updates: Nicole Nicholson worked with Della Rao on expanding the liturgy and the worship bulletin with the parts of the service previously omitted during the pandemic. These changes went into effect on Rally Day. Nicole made an announcement at service to review. All went smoothly.
- Presentation of the Lambs: Five children were eligible to receive lambs on Rally Day, of which four families attended. Per the request of Pastor Klose, Della Rao led the presentation.
- Worship & Music Calendar: Claudia Gross, Nicole Nicholson, and Della Rao are finalizing the calendar.
- Organization Chart: Claudia Gross and Della Rao are working with Vinny Ciro to complete the Church Organization Chart. Thank you to Vinny for your help.

Christian Education:

- Registration: The registration form for Sunday School and the class agreement form for Confirmation has been updated. Della Rao consulted with Dana Antonette and Nicole Nicholson on this process. An image and sharing permissions clause has been added.
- Curriculum: Della Rao developed age-appropriate weekly worksheets for Sunday School, so that we may further encourage students at all levels to learn to read the Bible.
- Classrooms: Thanks to Claudia Gross and Della Rao for setting up the classrooms and replenishing supplies.
- Confirmation Program: This year, Nicole Nicholson will serve as Program Coordinator. She will collaborate with Della Rao. Nicole will advise on content, and Della will handle logistics. The Team continues to work together on instructional development. We are very pleased with our progress.
- Confirmation Service: Jennifer Vizina requested that longtime family friend, Pastor Marsh Drege preside for the Confirmation of her son, Kyler. This would push Confirmation to Sunday, December 10th. The Confirmation Team is in full support of this request.

Nursery Board:

o **Room Numbers:** Dana Antonette and Vinny Ciro are consolidating the classroom numbers so that they are



- easier to follow for staff and the cleaning company. Della Rao will relay this information to the cleaners.
- O Cleaning: Dana Antonette and Della Rao continue to work with the cleaners on a classroom cleaning schedule, to accommodate for the longer school day.
- Summer Program: Summer Program was a big success. 40 children attended, which was maximum capacity. It was suggested that we research air conditioning ahead of next year, which would allow us to utilize additional classrooms and have more students.
- o **Registration:** The new school year began with 76 children enrolled, compared to 52 in 2022.
- Staffing: Two new teacher's aides were hired this school year. Three aides left, which leaves one open position remaining. Dana Antonette continues to interview candidates.

Council:

- o Fourth of July Parade: Special thanks to everyone who participated in the Fourth of July Parade. We especially thank George Balduf, Vinny Ciro, Bob Hasteadt, Roger Ohlander, Della Rao, and Craig Sparke, who helped to put our float together. We are proud of all who worked together to earn the Most Creative Float Award for the second year in a row!
- O Pastoral Vacancy: Nicole Nicholson and Hans Vogel proposed developing a job posting for the Pastor's position on LinkedIn and Indeed, which Council approved. They will both work with Della Rao on finding additional platforms to advertise the position. The applications of suitable Pastoral candidates will be forwarded to the Synod Office for consideration.
- O Correspondence: Council received a request from Jennifer Vizina regarding her son, Kyler's school fundraiser for a marching band trip to Paris. Council permitted Jennifer to distribute flyers and solicit sales of plants from White Post Farms during Coffee Hour.
- O Annual Floorcare: The annual floorcare (waxing and sealing) was completed successfully in early August. Thank you to our friends at Pronto Cleaning & Maintenance for a job well done. Council recommended that this project continue to be completed each summer.
- Steinbicker Stoop: The Steinbicker stoop was repaired successfully. The stoop was acid-washed, had minor joints repaired, and two stones replaced. Thank you to our friends at GenStar Masonry for a job well done. Thank you as well to WELCA for funding this project.
- o Landscaping/Tree Trimming: The annual summer shrubbery trimming and tree trimming were completed

- successfully. Some small trees which created obstructions were removed. Thank you to our landscaper, **Duran**, and to **Empire Tree Service** for a job well done.
- Security: R. Ahearn reported that a total of sixteen cameras have been installed around the property. Staff were verbally informed of what to do if a security incident occurs. A written protocol will also be provided. Two additional surveillance monitors will be installed in the Church and Nursery offices.
- Computers: Vinny Ciro has been working with the Church office to assess our computer system. He reported that Pastor's computer is running slowly due to very little RAM storage. He requested that we investigate having additional RAM installed. Council will investigate as requested ahead of our next meeting.
- o **Property:** Missing/defective rubber tips on the tables and chairs in Room 2000 were replaced. A chair storage cart in Steinbicker Hall was repaired, with two new support casters installed. Property requested permission to remove the Steinbicker kitchen's dishwasher to build a tool storage cabinet, which Council approved.

PROPERTY REPORT – OCT 2023

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things we find ourselves, and can accomplish without professional help. Our recent activities have included:

- Following the **Sanctuary floor Sealing work**, we arranged and re-fastened the chairs in rows to follow the "before" configuration as best as we could remember.
- After the **North Roof top A/C** failed during a Sunday service, we discovered that the Fan Belt came off the pulleys. It was our fault in that the belt wasn't retightened a month after a new one was last installed. We installed and "Aligned" a new belt which we will retighten, when we prepared the roof units for the "Heat" season.
- Following the **floor waxing in room 2000**, to prevent scratching, we ordered and installed numerous missing vinyl chair and table "**Feet**". We followed up with the **Gym and Education building** tables and chairs and while Room 10 was not waxed, we also checked and installed Chair and Table feet as needed.
- We re-directed two **South Side ceiling A/C vents** to reduce Piano Music chaos.
- We re-secured, **once again**, the Soap Dispenser in the Room 2000 kitchenette.
- We moved numerous winter sale items from the Thrift Shop to temporary storage in the Parsonage garage, then back into Room 2000 for the Labor Day W/E sale.
- A new desk unit, for Della's area, was assembled by Vinny and Gene.
- Vinny and Gene also dismantled the Computer enclosure in Della's area after moving, reconnecting, and securing the Computer on the new desk.
- We surveyed the office area power to ensure no overloading would occur if a new outlet were installed in **Office 2**, behind the Treasurer's desk. Vinny, Craig and Bob H installed the outlet, tapping into an adjacent one in the same wall.
- We replaced the dead battery in the Parsonage Garage door outside opener.
- We uncovered a Broken Swivel on a Chair Rack in the Gym. To prevent floor damage, we emptied the rack and removed the swivel. We ordered replacements and installed a new pair to the rack before restacking all the chairs.
- We replaced a chirping 10-year **Smoke Detector** in a lower classroom with a spare on hand. We also applied-for and received a Warranty replacement.
- We repaired the "frozen" bottom latch on the Room 10 rear exit door.
- We prepared and moved some "Men's" Table Fair Items to the Gym closet area.
- We "Burnished" a wine Chalice, which was "Dripping" excessively.
- We surveyed all the **Blinds in the Education building** for knotted cords and broken slats. **We will repair one and replace one when time/access permits.**
- We thank **Bill Henderson** for removing all the weeds overgrowing in the rear yard behind the fence adjacent the Cellar Stairway.

- * Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary**.
- * Research a possible upgrade to the Sanctuary sound system.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the Education Building Main Floor Bathrooms.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the two Room 10 Bathrooms.
- * Research replacing the rear yard Stairway cover.
- * Research the possibility and costs to remove and refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.

MISCELLANEOUS THINGS STILL NEEDING WORK

See Gene, Bill, Craig, Roger, Vinny, or Bob H. if you can help:

- * Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.
- * Repair numerous Cement issues. (Back walk, Pit wall, Pointing, Washes)
- * Price professional intervention to repair a rear yard broken and sinking sidewalk square,
- * Cleanup and clean out the lower Shop area and Property drawer. (WKG)
- * Investigate and strengthen the Altar screen Filigree panels which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.
- * Add electrical outlet in Office 2 to eliminate one extension cord. (CMPLT)
- * Repair the bottom latch on the rear room 10-exit door. (CMPLT)
- * Re-Seal the old office Duct Work to eliminate drafts.
- * Check for loose stair treads on the Room 10 and 20 stairways and re-glue.
- *Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit? Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. "Scout Project?" Extend the Sprinkler system into to the area.
- * Rebuild, once again, the rotting Front Sanctuary Planter Boxes. (Scout Project?)
- * Complete the Painting of the Thrift Shop incoming shed. (Scout Project?)
- * Install a pole for power to the far Parking lot area for Security. (Scout Project?)
- * Replace the Parsonage/Parking Lot "Post and Rail" fencing. (Scout Project?)
- * Check/reset coverage of the flagpole Sprinkler head. Zn1/North of walkway.
- * Touch-up the "Rust areas" on the outside fire escape.
- * Electro spray" all the Sanctuary Microphone connections. In-line, Floor, Wall jacks.
- * Winterize the Roof A/C's -Vacuum- Check Belts- Check Filters.
- * Prepare and Gas Snow Blower, Stage Snow melts and Shovels at entranceways.
- * Replace a "Blind Slat" in a main floor classroom. East classroom/South window.
- * Purchase/Replace (38.5") the broken Blind in the lower NS Storage/Slop sink area.
