## **BIBLE QUESTIONS:**

#### Should We Make New Year's Resolutions?

A resolution is a firm decision to do or not to do something. There are many resolutions in the Bible. In Psalm 119:105 we find familiar words, "*Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path. I have sworn and I will perform it, that I will keep Thy righteous judgments.*" With strong resolve, Joshua said, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord!" (Joshua 24:15) Like Joshua, let's make a firm decision to do what is right.

Let me point out two misconceptions about entering into a new year. First, 2022 will not automatically give you a fresh start. You must leave 2021 behind in good condition or you will find it stalking you in the new year. I must go to that person I have wronged and make things right. Then, I can go to God with my sin and he will make me righteous. It is important to address these issues, so that we might start again with a clean slate. Our sins do not vanish when we forget them, only God's forgiveness can remove them from us.

We can become very adept in covering up the things we have done wrong. Over time, we may have buried our problems so deep that they are almost forgotten. We should pray that our sins always trouble us deeply, even to the point of sleepless nights and an aching conscience. Although we might have almost forgotten our sins, God still sees them clearly. Ecclesiastes 12:14 teaches that "God will bring every work into judgment, including every secret thing, whether good or evil." So, I suggest that we leave 2021 behind in the best condition possible and this will give us a foundation to build a better new year.

The second misconception about entering the new year is that we have been promised another 12 months. If this guarantee exists, I have not seen it. The Bible teaches that we are not promised another year, month, day or minute. I don't bring this up to be morbid, but we need to have a dose of reality so we might put the important things in perspective.

Two clocks are always ticking, whether you notice them or not. The first clock is your "life clock". With each tick, your lifetime is becoming a little shorter. James 4:14 teaches, "Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." The second clock is God's "time clock." With each tick, time itself is becoming a little shorter. Since ancient times, men have been trying to predict when time will end. What does the Bible say about the end of time? In Matthew 25:13 Jesus spoke of His return, saying, "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour when the Son of Man shall come." He also taught, "But of that day and hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time is." (Mark 13:32-33) The apostle Paul must have been fully aware that we are not guaranteed another year, month, day, hour or minute. He wrote, "Behold, now is the accepted time. Behold, now is the day of salvation." (II Cor 6:2) We should not delay in making things right with our fellow man, and with God.

Resolutions are not just for New Year's. Resolve to be better and do better each and every day. These better ways of living are taught in the Holy Bible. The Psalmist said, "*This is my comfort in my affliction, for Your word has given me life.*" (*Psalm* 119:50)

## **PROPERTY REPORT – JAN 2022**

Our **Aging Retiree Group** continues to perform the maintenance and improvement items on the To-Do list that we can accomplish ourselves.

Our activities recently have included:

- We winterized the room 10 dehumidifier.
- Replaced numerous "Cricket traps" in the boiler rooms/storerooms/etc.
- On a request from the Scout organizations, we purchased, engineered, and **installed a light outside the rear door of room 10** to show light on the entrance stairway. The light bulb is solar and motion sensitive.
- We have received a **PSEG rebate of \$1,972.57** for our Education building LED conversion project. We have also now received the PSEG pre-approval to begin our **second LED lamp conversion project** for the remaining Sanctuary areas of the property. Unfortunately, we are now experiencing supply issues in getting the needed tubes, which we hope are only temporary with the Pacific Coast Container Port issues. NOTE: **IF ANYONE HAS A NEED FOR FOUR FOOT FLORESCENT TUBES (Basement,Garage,Etc),TAKE THEM FROM THE CHRISTIAN ED/YOUTH ROOM BEFORE WE DISPOSE OF THEM...**
- We changed the Narthex chandelier bulbs to LED.
- We activated/deactivated the Advent wreath, the Flower stands, Christmas Card banner, the Lamb banner and "Mr. Mittens".
- We installed the Entrance door light bars and set the timer, in time for Advent.
- We assembled and installed the **lawn Manger cutouts** in preparation for Advent.
- We activated the "Heat" lights under the 10/20 stairway and the 10/20 hallway pipe chase, to prevent the 300 Bathroom pipes from freezing.
- We installed the window spotlights for Christmas Eve, and re-stored them after.
- We Replaced a "needs batteries" soap dispenser after finding it with **no** batteries, and the battery cover missing!
- We provided input and plastic bags, for the Scout cleanup day on November 20<sup>th</sup>.
  We thank them for their annual attention to our property.
- We adjusted the main floor Education building thermostat to cover the Office area until 5PM when Della leaves.
- We ordered a new I-Pad cord and extension for Nichole to replace the bad one.
- We investigated the <u>"Bell Condensation"</u> issue and found the 2000 storeroom heat is working fine but the radiator mostly blocked off with miscellaneous items. We cleared away the items, raised an offending table, moved the bells off the floor to the table, and set the thermostat to come on earlier on Sundays. We also engineered and constructed a 2X6-raised platform for under the room table to store the bells. Upon checking, we are confident that these room changes will resolve the "cold room to warm room" condensation issue on Sunday mornings.
- We filled and Staged the **Snow-Melt containers and Shovels** at the entrance doors. Retiree Group

## THINGS TO DO

\*Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.

\*Power Wash the front Steinbicker stairway, north 10-20 wall, etc "greens", \*Scrape and Paint the white/bare trim above the Library and 2000 kitchenette.

\*Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit?, Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor.

\*Repair numerous **Cement issues** around the property. (Stairs, Pointing, Washes, loose items, price professional intervention?). ASAP

\*Prepare/Paint the outside Room 20 North window frame (Professional?).

\*Research and arrange for a "Seal coating" and re-striping of the parking lot and the Parsonage driveway. (Fall?Spring?)

\* Touch up the Roof top Air duct "Rust spots" with Silver paint on hand.

\* Re-tar around the intermittent leaking south most sanctuary AC duct.

\* Investigate the intercom feature for erradic operation or replace the system.

- \* Cleanup and clean out the shop area, Room 100, and the rear Shed area.
- \* Gather and discard all the "old" latex paint for the next "STOP" date.
- \* Gather and discard all the old Florescent Tubes.

\* Install a new stairway light by the back door to room 10 (CMPLT).

## **Research for Potential Projects**

\* Research and report on the possibility of **Siding on the 10/20 building**. \*Research the installation of white vinyl ornate trim covering (Pilasters/Door Surrounds) in the **front area outside the Sanctuary** in lieu of continuously pealing and painting.

\* Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary**.

\* Research the replacement of the wine stained Altar Carpeting.

\*Research extending the **lawn sprinklers** to cover the East side of Steinbicker **after grass restoration**.

\* Research the possibility and costs to **refurbish the Steeple Bell** and Cradle.
