Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we put the events of 2020 behind us, both good and bad, we look with anticipation to the new opportunities that we will have in 2021.

First, and foremost, we want to acknowledge the thirteen years of dedicated service that Elaine Dichiara provided to our congregation as our administrative assistant. A few months ago, Elaine announced to the church council that it was her intention to retire at the end of the year. The pandemic caused many celebrations to be dramatically curtailed or eliminated entirely. This was the case with Elaine, who has not been able to join us on Sunday mornings since we began worshipping again in person in the sanctuary. Since Elaine was to become a grandmother in December, she felt it was important that she protect her daughter and her yet to be born granddaughter by not being at gatherings where a lot of people were present. For that reason, we were unable to celebrate her retirement in the sanctuary on a Sunday morning as we had done with Pastor Nale. We hope that we can have that celebration for both of these dedicated servants of Christ Lutheran Church in 2021. For now, we wish Elaine many happy years of retirement in this new chapter of her life. We are grateful for the many things that she has done to help keep our church running smoothly, and the kindness she always showed to everyone entering our church office.

Since Pastor Nale's retirement at the end of October, we have been able to have supply pastors preside at our worship services. With the help of Bishop Egensteiner, an interim pastor, John Krahn, was appointed to Christ Lutheran Church. The church council voted on December 14th to accept the Bishop's recommendation. Pr. Krahn began his time with us on January 11th.

Also starting In January was our new Church Business Administrator, Christian DeRuiter. This position is a new one for our church. It combines a lot of what Elaine Dichiara's work was, combined with many duties that Pastor Nale took upon himself. We are adding many new responsibilities in order to grow our church and expand our presence on social media. Under this new arrangement, we hope to allow our next pastor to focus more on his/her liturgical work and leave the administrative work of the congregation with the Church Business Administrator. Throughout this year, we will constantly evaluate how things are progressing and where we might need to adjust things.



Some New Faces at Christ Lutheran Church

If you were able to get to church in January, you may have seen some faces you didn't recognize. As a very brief introduction:

Meet Pastor John Krahn



Pastor Krahn took on the position of interim pastor of our church on January 11th, though he did conduct two services here after Pastor Nale retired. You can see these on our YouTube channel (Nov. 29, 2020 and Dec. 20, 2020) He will be leading our church until we find a permanent pastor. Although he has taken the position as part-time, he will be conducting services, making visits or placing calls to members in hospitals or shut-ins at home, and performing other pastoral duties. He will be involved with the confirmands and Christian Education.

He has a lot of experience in these areas, having served as an ordained pastor for nearly fifty years. He has served both larger and smaller congregations during his ministry. Pastor Krahn is currently a church consultant working with congregations that are struggling to survive.

A graduate of Concordia College New York, he has also earned three Master's degrees (Union Theological Seminary) and a Doctorate (New York Theological Seminary).

Though officially retired, he has served the Church as a parish consultant and continues to write books, the most recent of which are entitled "From Surviving to Thriving-A Practical Guide to Revitalize Your Church" and "Special Stories Along Life's Journey". His published works include poetry, plays, professional articles in education, opinion pieces, devotional writing, and sermons. He is also a much sought after speaker and seminar leader.

He grew up in Fork, MD (named after a fork in the road) but now lives in Dix Hills with his wife, Doris. They have two daughters and three grandchildren and enjoy both travel and tennis.

Please help him to feel welcome as he helps us to grow our faith and church.

Christian DeRuiter

Christian DeRuiter started his work in the new position of Church Business Administrator for Christ Lutheran on January 19, 2021.

He will be responsible for all business operations of the congregation and assist the Pastor. You will find him in the church office managing the operations of the church from Monday to Friday from 10-6. His technical skills will be put to good use in managing a data base of our members, prepare up-to-date directories, maintain our websites and coordinate and distribute our video ministry. He will manage the preparation and distribution of communications from church, including the Spire, bulletins, annual reports and others either by mail or electronically or both. He will also be responsible for working with vendors on various church projects or activities.

There will be a lot on his plate but he has had a lot of experience and training for these tasks. Christian comes to us after spending nearly nine years at the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine in New York City as the Pastoral Events Coordinator, Assistant to Canon Pastor/Vicar and Columbarium Arrangements Secretary. He more recently worked for two years at Grace Church in Brooklyn Heights as Parish Administrator.

Christian studied history at Johns Hopkins University and has continued to study church administration and education for ministry. He is a member of the NYC Chapter of Church Administrators and is involved in the National Eagle Scout Association.

Please welcome Christian and introduce yourself to him and let him know about the activities you are involved with in the church. We will all need to work together to fulfill our mission especially in these trying times of the pandemic.

invited us to come over several times over the last few weeks to pick up bags and bags of food for the St. Johns Food Pantry, The Interfaith Nutritional Network (INN) and the New Life Food Pantry run by Lutheran Social Services in Uniondale.

This last year has caused a tremendous strain on local food pantries. There has been a great increase in the number of people needing help to put food on their tables. At the same time, the source of much of the food for the pantries has dried up. Many churches and temples have been closed or the numbers of people attending have been significantly reduced so the donations are way down. Thank you to all who have made donations of food or money to help their neighbors. The list of items most needed are listed below in the Spire, but all non-perishable food items are appreciated.

PROPERTY REPORT - FEB 2021

Our Small Aging Retiree Group has resumed our Pre-Pandemic activities. We have now caught up with most of the items on the To-Do list.

Our activities recently have included:

- We moved the Altar for the NS practice and NS Pageant, a few times.
- We removed the **collapsed Corner Sign** inside frame with all the pieces. We worked in room 10 to make a **repair by riveting** all the rails to the frame. We then secured the frame back into the sign. We installed the basic letters with the Christmas and future messages handled by Kathy and Jerry Fitzgerald.
- We thank Martin for volunteering and placing the Manger cutouts and lights on the front lawn. We found the missing Shepherd and lambs during the decorating of the Church and the retirees placed them with the manger.
- We removed six (6) broken screens from the windows in the Gym, ordered the necessary screening and spines, and re-screened them. We installed them into the window sashes and lubricated all the window sashes to glide better.
- We removed a broken "double pane" lower classroom window sash, installing a temporary cover and had the sash repaired during the winter NS break. We ordered replacement side spring parts and will install them as access permits.
- We assisted John Gross, and thank Roy Stone for his help, in removing some heavy items from the old youth room for special pick-up.
- We refilled all the Ice Melt containers following the first storm.
- We installed the spotlights in front of the Stained glass windows for Christmas Eve and returned them to storage after.
- We removed the lights from the ELCA lawn tree and placed back into storage.
- We returned the lawn manger and lights back to storage.
- We cleared a rusty hot water situation from the Sanctuary Water Heater.
- We replaced a chirping Smoke Detector battery in the lower hallway.
- We changed the Thermostat battery in Room 10, restoring the heat.
- We changed a "U" florescent bulb in the 2000 bathroom.

THINGS TO DO

See Roger, Bob R, Bill, Craig or Bob H if you can help:

- *Clean the ceiling light covers in room 10.
- *Arrange for the inspection and tagging of all the Fire Extinguishers.
- *Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.
- *Power Wash the front Steinbicker stairway, north 10-20 wall, etc "greens",
- *Scrape and Paint the white trim above the Library and 2000 kitchenette.
- *Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit?, Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor.
- *Repair numerous **Cement issues** around the property. (Pointing, washes, loose items, price professional intervention?).
- *Prepare/Paint the outside Room 20 North window frame (Professional?).
- *Clean and refurbish the vinyl replacement windows all around checking for smooth operation, weather stripping and locking capability. (Wkg)
- *Research and arrange for a "Seal coating" and re-striping of the parking lot and the Parsonage driveway. (spring)
- * Touch up the Roof top Air duct "Rust spots" with Silver paint on hand.
- * Refurbish Communion tables and replace the "red" felt shelf covers.
- * Repair a broken double pane NS window during winter break. (Cmplt)
- * Remove and repair the Broken Gym Screens. (Cmplt)
- * Investigate the repair needs of corner sign. (Cmplt)
- * Install a mailbox outside the Steinbicker entrance. (wkg)
- * Repair the thrift shop entrance door threshold.

Research for Potential Projects

- * Research and report on the possibility of Siding on the 10/20 building.
- * Research the installation of white vinyl ornate trim covering (Pilasters/Door Surrounds) in the front area outside the Sanctuary in lieu of continuously painting.
- * Research the possibility of new lighting for the Sanctuary.
- * Research the replacement of the wine stained Altar Carpeting.
- * Research extending the lawn sprinkler to cover the East side of Steinbicker after grass restoration.
- * Research installing Solar panels for electric on the Steinbicker building.
- * Survey and Research all cement sidewalks, steps, ramps, and washes for professional intervention.
- * Research having the lower two Steinbicker NS classroom Floor tiles removed, floor sealed and re-tiled. (NS issue)

February 2021

January brought us colder temperatures and crafts that were winter white. Snowmen filled many of the classrooms as it became abundantly clear that winter was indeed here.

In the pre-nursery classes the children are getting along beautifully and are really learning to play with one another. They are following directions and learning to take turns. It is such a pleasure to watch these little ones grow though out the year.

The threes were very busy painting melted snowmen and adding snowy white glitter to snowflakes to decorate their classrooms. They continue learning their colors, shapes and how to spell their names. The goal is that they know all their colors, shapes and how to spell their names by June. They have also started cutting and following the directions on how to hold a scissor and use their helping hand.


